Subject: The Library Board's budget recommendations

Date: March 1, 2006

The Library Board of Trustees' priority for new funding for the 2006-07 budget is for two full-time permanent positions, as per the Library Master Plan:

- Children's/Teen Librarian II
- Materials Processor

The total salary for these two positions is about \$64,000.

Our longer term budget recommendations are:

- Ensure completion of the bond-funded Library expansion by 2010 and with full 75,000 square foot capacity.
- Provide funds to support adult programming, now almost entirely funded by the Friends of the CHPL.
- Expect to fund a one-time collection expansion for the expanded facility to complement private funding now being sought by the Library Foundation.
- Plan to expand the operational budget, including more staff, to properly manage an expanded Library.

These recommendations and additional details about the Library are in the presentation we made to the Council on January 25, 2006, copy attached.

- Act on staffing recommendation

Year	Circulation	Program Attendance
2000-01	~300,000	~9,000
2001-02	~320,000	~10,000
2002-03	~340,000	~10,000
2003-04	~350,000	~11,000
2004-05	~365,000	~12,500

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Recommendations: Beyond 2006

- Expand Library to 75,000 square feet no later than 2010
- Increase staff for expanded facility
- Add books to complement the work of the Library Foundation's collection development project
- Budget for adult programs to supplement the work of the Friends of the Library

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Funding Sources

- Annual budget: Staff, materials, and maintenance
- Bond funds: Building expansion
- Library Gift Funds: Technology and other unfunded Library enhancements
- Private fund raising
 - Library Foundation: Capital campaign for books
 - Friends of the Library: Adult programs, children's programs, and books

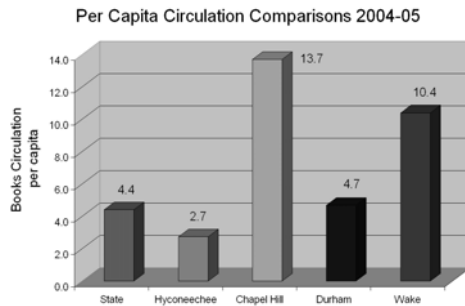
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Chapel Hill Public Library

- Leads NC in per capita circulation: 13.7 (State average is 4.4)
Source: State Library of North Carolina
- Spends 29% less than NC's average per circulation cost
Source: State Library of North Carolina
- Enjoys patron use increase of 2-4% annually
Source: CHPL patron records

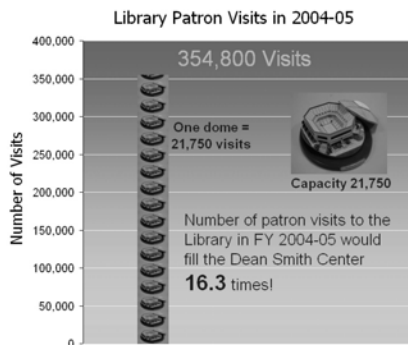
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Chapel Hill Reads!



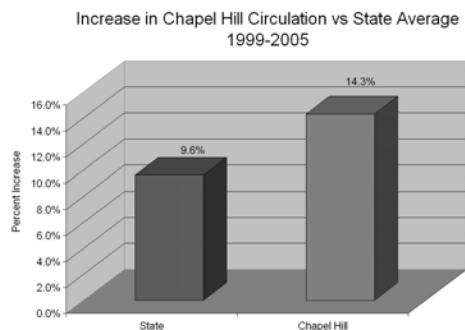
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Visitors
