Thanks for meeting with me last week, and hearing about my traffic & driveway problems.

My house is located on McCawley St (227) between Pittsboro and Ransom streets. The street is very heavily traveled and the parking much in demand.

At least 8-10 times per year I must call 911 because a car is parked over my driveway. Usually an hour has elapsed after the Chapel Hill police arrive and the tow truck makes its appearance. Of course the town must recover the cost from the driver/owner of the offending car.

In the past we have painted the driveway and adjacent gutters bright yellow, and placed reflectors on the trees. This does not always work, especially at night. Now that we have new curbs we will have to consider renewing it again.

In addition, we seem to be the unloved stepchild of our neighborhood association. None of the owners or tenants on my block have received notices of meetings for several years. I discovered the additional residential parking hours passed by the council only by accident.

We do have residential parking only until 12 P.M. then it becomes public and a Free-for-all. Just ask the parking police!
