MINUTES

Board of Aldermen

Town of Chapel Hill, N.C.

The Board of Aldermen met jointly with the Planning Board at a Public Hearing in the Town Hall on February 27, 1961, at 7:30 P.M. o'clock with the following present: Mayor Pro-Tem Strowd; Aldermen Wager, Robinson, Giduz, Walters and McClamroch; Town Attorney LeGrand and Town Manager Rose. Absent: Mayor Cornwell. Members of the Planning Board present were: Messrs. Fowler, Potter, Stewart, Umstead and David Neville.

Mayor Pro-Tem Strowd stated that the purpose of the Public Hearing was to consider three (3) matters for rezoning:

- A. From RA-10 to Suburban Commercial An area lying between Whitehall Antique Shop and New Masonic Building on E. Franklin Street. Mr. Gerald Tempest, applicant, stated he intends to build a studio-home with a gallery to display paintings, salesroom to display Italian imports, sport clothing for women, etc. Mrs. George Bason and Mr. R. B. Vaughan stated that they would like to see the area rezoned under Special se. Alderman Giduz moved that the request be referred to the Planning Board for recommendation, seconded by Alderman Robinson, and passed.
- B. From Agricultural to RA-20 An area bounded boothe North by Morgan Creek and on the West by the proposed Farrington Hills Sub-Division. Alderman Walters moved that the request be referred to the Planning Board for recommendation, seconded by Alderman Wager, and passed.
- C. Request for a Special Use Permit for extending a Mobile Trailer Court on N.C. Highway #86, near Forest Hills Subdivision. The following persons registered objections to the rezoning; Mrs.

T. M. Greene, Sr., Ted Green, Jr., Mr. Arthur Beaumont, and three others. They stated that property value would be lowered; that septic line conditions are questionable. Alderman Wager moved that the request be referred to the Planning Board for recommendation, seconded by Alderman McClamroch, and passed.

The Fublic Hearing was adjourned at 7:58 P.M. o'clock.

The Board of Aldermen then convened in a Regular meeting.

Minutes of February 13 Regular Meeting were approved on a motion by Alderman Walters, seconded by Alderman Wager, and passed.

Oral Petitions:

Northside PTA - A group came before the Board with Hilliard Caldwell, chairman, requesting some immediate action on the following requests: paving and widening School Lane, improvements to Church Street and a flasher light at Rosemary & Graham Streets. Town Manager stated that in accordance with Town's policy, the University has been advised to install the flasher light; that if curb and gutter is installed, a legal petition signed for 51% of the front frontage must be presented to the Board.

Written Petitions: Beer License J. S. Finch requests permission to sell beer on premises in the basement of the Professional Building on E. Franklin Street trading under the name of "Ye Olde Taverne, Inc". Alderman Giduz moved that the request be approved, seconded by Alderman Walters, and passed.

Town Attorney:

Alderman McClamroch moved the adoption of the following:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PLUMBING CODE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

SECTION I.

That the Plumbing Code of the Town of Chapel Hill, as adopted February 1, 1949, be and the same is hereby amended by striking out all of Article III, entitled "Fees" and re-writing the same to read as follows:

ARTICLE III. Fees

Sec. 20. Schedule of fees.

Prior to the issuance of any permit for plumbing work within the Town limits, fees for the inspection of the work covered by such permit shall be paid to the city in conformity with the following schedule:

There shall be a fixture charge of one dollar (\$1.00) for each fixture which shall include any trapped outlet and boiler and heater. The charge for each sewer connection made within the Town of Chapel Hill shall be Three dollars (\$3.00). No permit shall be required for the renewal of hot water heater or storage tank of same capacity and design.

Sec. 21.

21. Application of schedule.
The fees prescribed in the preceding section shall apply to all old work as well as new, and to inspections made necessary by moving any house from one location to another or by raising the new house.

SECTION II.

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This the 27th day of February, 1961. seconded by Alderman Walters, and unanimously adopted. ****

The Board discussed "A Resolution Relative to Fees for Plumbing Permits & Sewer Connections Outside of the Town Limit", and agreed that Town Attorney, Town Manager and the Plumbing Inspector should clarify one or two charges before being passed by this Board.

In re: A threatened suit for false arrest wherein several Chapel Hill Policemen are defendants, was discussed. The Board authorized Town Attorney to represent the policemen in the matter.

Town Manager:

Thoroughfare Plan - Town Manager stated he has forwarded the Thoroughfare Plan to the State Highway Commission with the approval of the Board of Aldermen, and has received a letter of acknowledgement.

Tax Refunds: - Town Manager stated that in making prepayment the following tax payers have overpaid 1960 taxes. Alderman Walters moved that the Town adjust taxes for George Livas Estate in the amount of \$7.23, and Eubanks Drug Company in the amount of \$17.86, seconded by Alderman Robinson, and passed; that in the matter of overpayment by Arden Properties, Inc. in the amount of \$316.05 account of a reduced valuation made by Orange County, the Board agreed that a statement from the Board of Assessors should be received to support the refund.

Sewer Rent - E. H. Leng, Oakwood Drive. Town Manager discussed the \$60.00 sewer rent for the years 1954 and 1955 before Oakwood was annexed to Chapel Hill; that he seeks to be relieved of paying this amount as there is uncertainly as to just when this property was connected. Town Manager was requested to consult with Mr. C. E. Hornaday for help to try to clear up the matter.

Town Charter

Alderman Walters moved the adoption of the proposed Charter as revised, seconded by Alderman Wager, and unanimously adopted. The Board noted that the Charter has been presented to the Legislature but no action will be taken for ten (10) days during which time any necessary adjustments or changes can be made.

Town Hall Location

Alderman Giduz moved that Town Manager be authorized to request the Bond Attorneys in New York to prepare an Ordinance for a bond referendum, and that Town Manager and the Finance Committee suggest Alderman McClamroch, and passed

Building Heights

Town Manager stated that the University are anxious to have the zoning requirement on building heights amended. Alderman Walters moved that the matter be referred to the Planning Board for recommendation, seconded by Alderman Robinson, and passed.

Committee Reports:

Alderman Robinson, chairman of the Street Committee, stated that together with the Town Manager they looked into the request of A. C. Rogers, W. University Drive for a street light, but did not see the need for such a light.

NEW BUSINESS:

Alderman Walters stated that Prs. Charlotte Huse, Gimghoul Road has requested that relief be given to the parking situation that exists near the St. Thomas Moore Catholic Church during church services; that perhaps a policeman could check the situation. Alderman nobinson - Discussed the old leaning chimney on the W. Rosemary Street lot next to J. C. Burnett's, also about old houses which have been condemned and should be torn down. The Building Inspector was requested to make a list of such houses. for information.

There being no further business to be discussed at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 9:10 P.M. o'clock.


