### BOARD OF ALDERMEN

TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

The Board of Aldermen met for a Special Meeting at 9:00 A.M. Thursday, October 3, 1968 with the following members present: Mayor McClamroch; Aldermen Prothro, Giduz, Smith, Varley, Ethridge and Kage. Also present were Town Manager Peck, Town Clerk Roberts and Town Attorney Denny.

### WATER CONSERVATION

Mayor McClamroch read a proposed ordinance restricting the use of water for the duration of the emergency. Alderman Giduz moved adoption of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE TO LIMIT THE USE OF WATER DURING

### AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, there exists an abnormal shortage of water for the Town of Chapel Hill causing a substantial reduction in the reserve supply of water; and

WHEREAS, such supply has been reduced to such a point that an emergency exists which may seriously threaten the health and safety of the residents of the Town; and

WHEREAS, it is essential for the protection of the health and safety of the citizens of Chapel Hill that restrictive measures be imposed upon the use of water supplied within the Town of Chapel Hill through the facilities of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

- Sec. 1. An emergency has been created by a shortage in the Town water supply, and exists, threatening the health and safety of the citizens of the Town.
- Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to use or permit the use of water from the water system within the Town of Chapel Hill supplied through the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill facilities for any of the following purposes, until such time as this ordinance shall be amended or repealed:
  - (a) To wash any automobile or other motor vehicle.
  - (b) To water or sprinkle any lawns, shrubs, yards, streets, sidewalks, or to use water for any similar purpose.
  - (c) To operate any air conditioning system which does not recover and reuse the water in connection therewith; provided, this restriction shall not apply to the use of water in connection with refrigeration for the preservation of perishable foods.
- Sec. 3. Any violation of the provisions of the provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable as provided by G. S. 14-4.
- Sec. 4. All ordinances and clauses of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 5. This ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption.

MINUTES

BOARD OF ALDERMEN

TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

The Board of Aldermen met at a regular meeting on Monday October 14, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor McClamroch; Aldermen Giduz, Smith Varley, Ethridge and Kage. Alderman Prothro was absent. Also present were Town Manager Peck and Town Clerk Roberts and Town Attorney Denny.

#### MINUTES

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Ethridge, that minutes of the regular meeting of September 23, 1968 and the Special Meeting of October 3, 1968 be approved as corrected. This was unanimously carried.

TAXES

Mr. Paul Section of Barclay Road told the Board that he objected to the tax bill as he did not come into the city limits until June 1968 and he felt that this tax bill was for a full year of 1968. He also stated that he did not think he was properly annexed in the first place and that he wanted a refund on the sewer that had been built a number of years ago in the area. Mr. Denny tried to explain the tax time table and fiscal year and agreed to go into it with Mr. Sexton at some later time.

REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL Mayor McClamroch told the Board that Mr. Thomas Hoyt had declined the appointment to the Redevelopment Commission and that another appointment was needed. Alderman Giduz placed the name of Bynum Weaver of Brooks Street in nomination and noted that this was for a four year term. Alderman Smith nominated John Caldwell of Church Street. Alderman Ethridge suggested that the Mayor ask for recommendations from the Redevelopment Commission. The Mayor and Aldermen voted on the two persons nominated and Mr. Weaver was chosen by a vote of 4-2. The Town Clerk then administered the oath of office to the previously named members Mr. Perry, Mrs. Clark, Dr. Jones and Mr. Nelson. Mayor McClamroch thanked these individuals for accepting the appointment and welcomed them as persons who could do a great deal for the development of Chapel Hill.

### FARRINGTON HILLS SUBDIVISION-SECTION II-FINAL

Mayor McClamroch read a transmittal from the Planning Board recommending approval of the preliminary and final plat of Farrington Hills Subdivision, Section II, Lot 23 & 24
