MINUTES OF A PUBLIC HEARING AND REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, MONDAY, JULY 21, 1975 AT 7:00 P.M.

The Board of Aldermen met for a joint Public Hearing with the Carrboro Board of Aldermen on July 21, 1975 at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Build-The roll was reported as follows:

A quorum of the Board was present and in attendance at the meeting. Also present were Town Manager Chester Kendzior, Jr., Town Clerk Dave Roberts, Town Attorney Emery Denny, Carrboro Mayor Robert Wells, and Carrboro Alderman Fred Chamblee.

PUBLIC HEARING

Sedimentation Control

Soil Erosion and Mayor Lee described the format to be followed for the Public Hearing and welcomed the Carrboro Mayor

and Board of Aldermen. Mayor Lee then recognized Alderman Welsh who gave a brief background of the Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control program in North Carolina. She said that the State feels that, even though there are State laws to control soil erosion and sedimentation, legislation should be enacted and enforced at the local level, to make the laws better understood by citizens and more easily enforced. Alderman Welsh then recognized Mr. Mark Burnham to present the proposed ordinance. Mr. Burnham then read through the proposed ordinance and explained its content. He said that most of the laws contained in the ordinance are already provided for by State law, but that the local ordinance must include them.

Mayor Lee then called for any person opposed to the ordinance to take the floor.

Mr. Calvin Mellott said the ordinance would be good for contractors, but State already has the same laws; and that the difference the new ordinance would make would be to require contractors to pay for a grading permit. He said this would mean higher costs for citizens, as the contractor would pass on the costs.

Mayor Lee called for any person supporting the ordinance to take the floor.

Ms. Jane Sharp said she does not feel the State has a workable Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control ordinance; and that she supports the ordinance proposed.

Mayor Lee introduced the Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Task Alderman Welsh requested that one of the Task Force members respond to Mr. Mellott's statement. Mr. Burnham said that the cost of uncontrolled erosion would be greater in the long run than the cost for the control. Alderman Marshall said that she supports the ordinance; and she made some brief wording suggestions. Alderman Cohen questioned, concerning Section 5 e (3), if the State already enforces this law. Mr. Burnham said that the State has specific laws but does not enforce them stringently. Alderman Cohen asked who will issue the permits. Ms. Flo Garrett, County Commissioner, said that the County would have an ordinance, but that each local unit would be responsible for their permits. Town Attorney Emery Denny said that this would be a policy decision by each board; and that he feels the fees which is also a policy decision should be the same County-wide. Alderman Smith asked who would hire the Commissioner to enforce these laws. Ms. Garrett said the Task Force is willing to work with the local boards--however each Board wants to implement their plans. Alderman Fred Chamblee asked, concerning Section 21 a (2), if the State has any scale for, or minimum, fees. Mr. Burnham said no.

Mayor Wells said that the Boards are being asked to pass an ordinance that has loopholes; and that he feels there is a lot of study needed before the Boards should adopt the ordinance. Mr. Burnham said that at one time the Task Force had a much more stringent ordinance, but that the State had warned them against trying to be too strong. Mayor Lee commended the Task Force for their work on the proposed ordinance. He said the Boards should study the ordinance and possibly a delegation from each entity could discuss the ordinance and bring it back to another joint meeting of the Boards. Ms. Garrett said that that order of study would be very agreeable with the Task Force. Mayor Lee said that Carrboro will have to hold its own public hearing on this ordinance before they could adopt it.

The Public Hearing was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

REGULAR MEETING

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the minutes of the July 7, 1975 meeting be approved as corrected.

Bus Routes and Services Mr. Kurt Jenne reported on the studies that have been made and presented, in detail, the suggested changes on the bus routes. Mayor Lee said there is a problem with the "F" route between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. from University Mall to Colony Woods that he hopes will be corrected with the new route changes. Mr. Jenne said that particular emphasis has been placed on increasing services to the routes having a greater demand; and on decreasing services on those routes with little or no ridership. He said that the Transportation Department will make a very careful route check after 90 days of service and will make the necessary adjustments at that time. Mr. Jenne said that he and Mr. John Pappas have met with representatives of the University and that they have agreed to all of the service changes. Mayor Lee said that the University has also approved and granted the 10% increase as requested. Dr. Marvin Silver, Chairman of the TAC, said that, generally, the TAC agrees with the proposed changes. Alderman Marshall—said that the Mall service should be considered very carefully. She said that, on eliminating night routes, she feels the Board should consider the monetary value versus the bodily safety of citizens who could not use a bus. A citizen said that she is disappointed that the bus does not serve the Library on its summer schedule as there are handicapped people who need the bus. Alderman Cohen pointed out that the Town has purchased a special bus whichwill be specifically for handicapped and elderly citizens. said that the Board had agreed that 11:30 p.m. was a valid time to which the buses should run, and that he is concerned about the proposed 9:30 p.m. ending time for some of the routes. Dr. Silver said that this has been studied carefully, and will be further studied after the new changes are implemented; and that if the ridership warrants, recommended changes will be presented to the Board by November 1, 1975. Alderman Cohen expressed concern about how Blue Cross-Blue Shield will be served. Mr. Dick Rohde said that there will an express bus from Blue Cross-Blue Shield to the Town limits, but there will be neighborhood service within the Town limits. Dr. Silver said he forsee's the need of the TAC studying jointly with the Energy Conservation Task Force on some of the bus route designs. Mayor Lee said he feels the Transportation Department's first concern should be service; second is cost to the citizens; and third should be energy conservation. He said he feels that Glen Lennox, the Library, and handicapped and elderly persons should be high priority considerations. Alderman Smith said that maneuverability should not be a factor in considering bus routes; and that constant data should be kept on ridership and demand for services. Mr. Rohde said that a very intensive driver training program will be started in September which will help maneuverability and "jack-rabbit" starts, both of which have been a problem. Mayor Lee called for any particular improvements on which the Board would like to request further study and recommendation back to the Board. Alderman Marshall suggested alternating the "B" and "F" routes that buses should not be stopped before 11:00; and that service should be provided to the Library.

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the proposed Fall bus routes be implemented contingent upon reinstituting service to the Library and extending service of some of the routes until 11:30 p.m. The motion was unanimously carried.

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the minutes of July 14, 1975 be approved as corrected. The motion carried unanimous-<u>ly.</u>

DOMO

Mayor Lee said that Chapel Hill has received five positions from DOMO, a total of \$37,000 in monies, and that he and the Manager are requesting that two carpenter positions be approved, which employees could be used to build the benches at the bus stops and other Town projects, and possibly be available to the Housing Authority. Mayor Lee asked Alderman Welsh to work as liaison to the administration for the con-

struction of these benches.

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Marshall, that the nominations be closed, and Ms. Katherine

Klingberg be re-appointed, by acclamation, to the Board of Adjustment for a three-year term expiring June 30, 1978. The motion carried unanimously.

Appointment, Planning Board

Alderman Marshall moved, seconded by Alderman Smith, that Ms. Ann Slifkin's name be placed in nomina-

tion; that the nominations be closed; and that Ms. Ann Slifkin be appointed, by acclamation, to the Planning Board for a five-year term expiring June 30, 1980. The motion carried unanimously.

Appointment, Recreation Commission

Alderman Cohen moved, seconded by Alderman Smith, that the nominations be closed, and that Ms. Lieberman be

appointed, by acclamation, to the Recreation Commission for a three year term expiring December 31, 1978. The motion carried unanimously.

Bids--Chain Link Fence

Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the bid of

Allied Fence Corporation be accepted to furnish and install a chain link fence for the West Chapel Hill Cemetery. The motion carried unanimously. BECONE.

Bids--Asphalt

Town Manager Kendzior reported on the bids for Asphalt supplies,

and the recommendation by the Director of Public Works that the Town continue with the Town's present arrangement for purchasing these. supplies. Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, to turn down all bids for asphalt supplies and to accept the Manager's recom-The motion carried unanimously.

Loading Zone

Alderman Smith said the Streets Committee recommends that the bus

zone in front of the Merchant's Association, where there is also a loading zone, should be moved to the front of Suttle's Texaco. Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh that an ordinance be prepared to make the recommended changes. Said motion was unanimously carried.

Speeding

Alderman Smith said that Committee has had complaints on speeding

on Rogerson Drive; and that the Police Department has been using radar and citing all violations. Mayor Lee requested that the Police Department cite all speeders on Ephesus Church Road also.

Services, County-wide

Alderman Welsh said that she and Mr. Smith met with representatives

from Carrboro and Orange County to discuss each entity's share of the budgets of county-wide services utilized by citizens throughout the County. She gave a report of the discussion at the meeting; and said that it was suggested at the meeting that an interjurisdictional committee could be set up to further discuss and study the possibilities of joint responsibilities of services. Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the Board of Aldermen go on record as supporting the idea of a County-wide interjurisdictional committee to study joint services to citizens throughout Orange County. The motion carried unanimously.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen, Town of Chapel Hill, that S21-28.1, "Bus Stops," of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Chapel Hill, be amended to read as follows:

Section I

Sec. 21-28.1 Bus Stops.

From and after the effective date of this section the town manager is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be marked off and provided spaces at or about the intersections of the streets, hereinafter named, which shall be so marked and designated by appropriate lines, words or signs as "bus stops." Each of the spaces hereafter designated, when so marked, shall be for use as a bus stop by licensed and franchised motor buses operated for the public transportation system, and in which spaces said motor buses shall be authorized to stop for the purpose of receiving and discharging passengers. It shall be unlawful for any other vehicle to park in such designated bus stops.

Key to listing of stops: The first letter under DIRECTION (N, S, E or W) indicates the general direction (north, south, east or west) of the route itself. Thus "S-L," for example, indicates the southbound leg of the L, Lake Forest-merrit Mill. Because most streets are not due east-west or north-south, this method of indicating on which side of a street a stop lies has been chosen in preference to giving compass directions.

AN ORDINANCE TO GRANT A FRANCHISE TO OPERATE TAXICABS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

SECTION I

WHEREAS, G.S. §160A-304 provides that the Town, by Ordinance, may orant a taxi franchise for the operation of a stated number of taxicabs within the Town, and

THEREAS, Tar Heel Cab Co. was under date July 22, 1974 granted a Eranchise for the operation of twelve (12) taxicabs within the Town, and

WHEREAS, Ken Pasour, d/b/a K & M Co. and Tar Heel Cab Co. is now the owner of Tar Heel Cab Co., and proposes to operate said twelve (12) taxicabs individually, and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the public convenience and necessity requires the operation of up to twelve (12) taxicabs and that the said Ken Pasour is a proper person for said franchise.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL, that pursuant to the authority contained in G.S. §160A-304 and Article II, Chapter 20, Code of Ordinances, Town of Chapel Hill, Ken Pasour be, and he is hereby granted the franchise to operate a total of twelve (12) taxicabs within the Town upon compliance with the provisions of Chapter 20, Code of Ordinances, Town of Chapel Hill.

SECTION II

All Ordinances and portions of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This the 21st day of July, 1975.
