MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 1985, 7:30 P.M.

Mayor Joseph L. Nassif called the meeting to order. Council Members present were:

David Godschalk Jonathan Howes Beverly Kawalec David Pasquini Nancy Preston R. D. Smith Bill Thorpe

Council Member Marilyn Myers Boulton was absent, excused. Also present were Town Manager David R. Taylor, Assistant Town Managers Sonna Loewenthal and Ron Secrist, and Attorney Ralph Karpinos.

Petitions

Mr. Henry Whitfield petitioned Council to speak to item 4c, University Heights sewer improvements, and introduced into the record a written petition addressing his concerns over the placement of the sewer line connections. (For a copy, see Clerk's files.)

COUNCIL MEMBER SMITH MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GODSCHALK TO RECEIVE THE PETITION. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY, (8-0).

Manager Taylor introduced and welcomed Bruce Heflin, the new Public Works Director, to the Mayor and Council.

Minutes

COUNCIL MEMBER PRESTON MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER SMITH TO ADOPT THE MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 9, 1985 AS CIRCULATED. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY, (8-0).

Recognition of Retiring Mayor and Council

Council Member Thorpe said he felt there should be some form of recognition for those Council Members who will retire from office in December. He said Council Member Preston and he requested authorization to work with the staff to prepare resolutions to recognize the retiring Council Members.

COUNCIL MEMBER SMITH MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER HOWES TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 85-R-169. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY, (8-0).

The resolution, as adopted, reads as follows:

A RESOLUTION REGARDING RECOGNITION OF RETIRING TOWN COUNCIL MEMBERS (85-R-169)

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Chapel Hill that the Council hereby authorizes Council Members Bill Thorpe and Nancy Preston to prepare, with the assistance of staff, resolutions of appreciation for the Mayor and retiring Town Council members.

Franklin Hills Report

Manager Taylor gave a brief report on whether or not this item had been reviewed by the Planning Board. He said the staff believed the plan reviewed by Council on September 9th was one that had been reviewed by the Planning Board. Manager Taylor stated that it would not be unreasonable to ask the Planning Board to review the preliminary plan again. He recommended that Council adopt resolution 170a which would require the Planning Board to review the plan again.

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Mayor Nassif asked for clarification that the plan had been reviewed. Manager Taylor replied that the Board had reviewed the plan.

Council Member Godschalk said that since the plan had been reviewed by the Planning Board then he did not see any reason to send it back to them.

Mayor Nassif asked if Council would like for the Manager to place this item back on the agenda. Council concensus was in favor of this motion.

COUNCIL DIRECTED MANAGER TAYLOR TO PUT THIS ITEM BACK ON A FUTURE AGENDA.

Council Member Pasquini stated that he would like the questions posed at the September 9th Council meeting regarding this item answered when it was brought back to Council.

Colony Woods - Effect of Development Outside of Town

George Small, Town Engineer, made a brief presentation on the petition of the Bjornsson's regarding the flooding problem they are experiencing at their home in Colony Woods due to development outside of the Town limits. He said that the Bjornsson's had sued a developer of land in Durham County because of the drainage problem and that the suit was still in litigation. Mr. Small said the staff felt the Town should take no action until the suit was settled, and recommended that contact be made with OWASA and Durham County to instigate a system whereby the Town would review those projects which could affect Chapel Hill but were not in the Town's planning jurisdiction.

Council Member Preston asked when the Bjornsson's case would be heard by the Supreme Court. Mr. Small said he was not certain.

Mayor Nassif stated that he felt the residents should not have to wait until a decision was made by the Courts before they received help with the drainage problems. He felt the Town should do something now and asked Council to give him the authority to write to OWASA to not extend water and sewer lines into Durham County without approval from the Town. He also suggested he contact Durham County officials to set in motion a way to correct the drainage problems affecting the Bjornsson's.

COUNCIL MEMBER SMITH MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER PRESTON TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO CONTACT OWASA AND DURHAM COUNTY OFFICIALS IN AN EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE PLANNING PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH DEVELOPMENTS WHICH AFFECT CHAPEL HILL RESIDENTS BUT WHICH ARE OUTSIDE OF THE TOWN'S PLANNING JURISDICTION.

Mr. Wayne Munden, Chief Engineer for OWASA, commented on the situation saying that OWASA was responsive to problems and that they would be willing to help try to solve these problems. He said when OWASA receives a request for extension of water and sewer line outside of the County they regularly inform those Planning Departments which would be affected.

Manager Taylor expressed concern about having the Town correct the Bjornsson's drainage problems before the suit was settled. He said the suit instigated by the Bjornsson's involved the question of who was responsible for the drainage problem, Chapel Hill or Durham County and the developer. Manager Taylor said the Town may be considered to be accepting the responsibility for the problems if it were to correct the problems before hearing the Court ruling.

Mr. Stewart Levine, the attorney representing the Bjornsson's, commented that if the Bjornsson's failed in their attempt to get the developer to pay for damages and to correct the problem they would probably bring suit against the Town for the same thing. He also said the developer was attempting to get the Town named as a co-respondent in the suit already in question.

THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY, (8-0).

George Small gave a brief report on the status of the sewer lines installed in University Heights funded by Community Development (CD) monies. He said this report was the result of a petition by Jon Harder in which he suggested discrimination took place in providing service to vacant lots and deficiencies in the project. Mr. Small said the project was in compliance with CD regulations. He said there were six homes and two vacant lots which could not use the sewer lines due to a design error. Mr. Small said the sewer lines from these homes/lots were too low to allow for gravity connection. He said for all but two of the lots the engineering firm should have been able to see from the contours of the lots, which slope towards the back, that the sewer lines would be lower that what they had estimated for the entire area.

Mr. Small said in response to the charge of discrimination that water and sewer stub-outs were provided to all houses existing at the date of the grant application and CD funds also paid for one stub-out to each undeveloped lot or contiguous series of lots in single ownership.

Mayor Nassif said he was not sure the engineering firm could be blamed for not knowing where the existing sewer or septic tank lines on the lots were. He said for the consultant to have this knowledge would mean he would have to get the property owner's permission to enter onto the property and dig up the sewer lines.

Manager Taylor replied that for several of the lots the engineering consulting firm should have been able to see that the existing sewer lines were deeper than the others by just looking at the lay of the land.

Council Member Thorpe asked how the contractors for those lots which were not connected but had had stub-outs would know at what depth to put the sewer lines. Manager Taylor said that plans of the stub-outs were available from the Town.

Council Member Pasquini said he felt the consultant should have been more thorough in putting in the sewer lines to allow for gravity flow.

Council Member Smith said he felt Council should let the Manager try to work the problems out with the engineering firm and if any action needed to be taken then the Council could enter into the matter.

Mayor Nassif reiterated that he felt more information should be provided to the consultants prior to any work being done so that this situation would not happen again.

Mr. Henry Whitfield, speaking as a resident and property owner, commented that he felt the engineering firm had been negligent in their laying of the sewer lines and that the Town had been discriminatory in the laying of stub-outs to undeveloped property.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES (85-0-61)

BE IT DRDAINED by the Council of the Town of Chapel Hill That Section 21-28.1 of the Town Code of Ordinances be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 21-28.1. Bus stops.

From and after the effective date of this section [September 23, 1985], the town manager is hereby authorized and directed to cause spaces to be marked off and provided at or about the following intersections of the public streets, hereinafter named, which shall be so marked and designated by appropriate lines, words or signs as "bus stops." Each of the spaces hereafter designated, when so marked, shall be for use as a bus stop by licensed and franchised motor buses operated for the public transportation system, and in which spaces said motor buses shall be authorized to stop for the purpose of receiving and discharging passengers. It shall be unlawful for any other vehicle to park in such designated bus stops.

Key to listing of stops: The letter under Direction (N,S,E or W) indicates the general direction (north, south, east or west) of the road on which the stop is located. In the case where a street does not traverse due north-south or east-west, the predominate direction of travel is used. The "From" and "To" columns indicate the stop's distance in feet from the listed intersection.

The places to be designated and marked as stops are as follows:
