"Minutes of Regular Meeting"
Board of Aldermen--Chapel Hill, N. C.
April 28, 1952

The regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in thw Town Hall on April 28, 1952, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present were Mayor Lanier, Aldermen Putnam, Fowler, Burch, Fitch, Cornwell, Auditor Peacock, Attorney LeGrand, and Town Manager Rose.

Miss Elizabeth Branson, Mr. William Harrison, and Mr. Y. Z. Cannon appeared before the Board in reference to the proposed regulations on signs and awnings prepared by a committee of the Merchants Associations. Mr. Cannon outlined the proposed regulations, and after some discussion the matter was referred to the Safety Committee for recommendations to be reported back to the Board.

Messrs. James Snipes, C. A. McDougal, C. F. Williams, W. A. Lampley and James Peace, representing the Negro Civic Club, presented a request for further consideration of the matter of a traffic light at W. Franklin Street and Merritt Mill Road. James Snipss reported that a survey had shown 344 crossings of the intersection by school children. After some discussion the matter was referred to the Safety Committee for further study and recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

The Town Manager read another written request from Mrs. Josie DeLancy for reconsideration of the rezoning of her lot at the Northwest Corner of the University Campus. On motion of Alderman Fitch, seconded by Alderman Putnam, the matter was referred to the Board of Adjustment for consideration as a hardship case for use as a residence.

The Town Manager read a request from Mr. C. S. Bartlett, representing the Taxicab operators, for a hearing on taxicab fares. The matter was referred to the Utilities Committee with the request that they hold a hearing with the operators and report their recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

Town Attorney, LeGrand, reported to the Board on the Grover Bush case and the Groves case. The Town Manager presented a bill from Mr. Bonner Sawyer in the amount of \$100.00 for services on the Bush case and a bill in the amount of \$45.25 for printing of the appeal to the Supreme Court in the Groves Case. On motion of Aldermen Butnam, seconded by Aldermen Fowler, and the bills were approved and ordered to be paid out of the Contingency Fund.

Town Manager Rose was authorized to refund \$4.29 to C. A. Houck for taxes charged in error.

Town Manager Rose reported the need of new radio equipment in the two police cars, to replace the old ones secured from Government surplus four years ago. On motion of Alderman Putnam, seconded by Alderman Fitch, the Town Manager was authorized to purchase the equipment at \$447.00 each, to be paid out of the contingency Fund.

The Town Manager presented a list of automotive equipment owned by the Town for consideration by the Board and outlined the probable needs for the coming year.

The Town Manager presented a proposed paving program amounting to \$11,543.00, the cost of which to be paid for out of the Powell Bill funds. He was authorized to secure bids on the profect.

A request from the Bank of Chapel Hill was read before the Board, concerning the widening and paving of the alley leading from E. Rosemary Street to the rear of the business district. On motion by Aldermen Putnam, seconded by Aldermen Burch, the follwoing was passed. (A) That the Town of Chapel Hill pave said alley in the business Zone if and when a total width of 16 feet be dedicated to the public. (B) and that this shall be the Town's policy war until further notice.

The Cemetery Committee recommended that a section of three lots, numbers 28, 29, and 30, in Block A, totaling 18 graves, in the New Negro Cemetery be set aside for paupers, and that a tool house be constructed at a cost not to exceed \$250.00, to be paid for out of the Cemetery Fund. The recommendations were passed unanimously.

The street committee reported that it had visited the drainage ditch off Ransom Street on the complaint of Miss Josie Pritchard and the ditch off Carr Street and Pritchard Avenue on complaint of W. S. Crawford. The committee had no recommendations and no action was taken.

On motion of Alderman Burch, seconded by Aldermen Putnam, the meeting adjourned at 11:10 P. M.

After hearing the minutes of the Board of Aldermen for April 28, 1952 read as amended, on motion made by Aldermen Putnam and seconded by Aldermen Fitch the minutes were approved by vote of the Board of Aldermen this the 12th day of May, 1952.
