My suggestion is that the major new north-south roadway to be built parallel to


Airport Road through Carolina North memorialize Dr. King. It will be the principal



Recently I became aware that the Town Council has received a request to rename "Airport Road ", presumably because of the planned closing of the airport.

I am the owner/taxpayer of 6 rental properties along this road and a name change would obviously entail measurable upheaval and expense, both for my renters and myself.

More important however will be the impact on the commercial value of this real estate. It is not uncommon for geographic or historical features, with a street named after these, to have changed or become no longer relevant. In such cases, and this also applies to Airport Road, the established name may have become an identifyer and symbol with a commercial value of its own, irrespective of its historical origins

I am really concerned that a name change of Airport Road will affect the value of my possessions negatively and I would be grateful for this consideration to be brought to the attention of town council members and officials which are involved.
