

# SUMMARY OF COMMUNITY DESIGN COMMISSION CONCEPT PLAN COMMENTS

**Subject:** Starbucks at Eastgate Shopping Center

## **General Comments**

- 1. Support coffee shop instead of the gas station.
- 2. Like the submitted architectural rending.
- 3. Proposal will liven up this comer of the shopping center.

#### Access and Circulation

- 4. Close existing East Franklin Street driveway and convert area to landscaping.
- 5. East Franklin Street drive should be converted to right-idright-out only.
- 6. Proposed internal access drive conflicts with internal traffic circulation near TCBY drive and vehicle stacking queue waiting to exit onto East Franklin Street. Consider relocating this internal access drive.
- 7. Provide greenway link/public easement to Booker Creek.
- 8. Include a pedestrian connection between proposed development and Bruggers.
- 9. Provide a pedestrian crosswalk between proposed development and TCBY.

# **Parking**

10. Need to address the loss of parking spaces near the adjacent Bruggers.

## Landscaping

- 11. Provide more landscaping and less impervious surface area. Consider the use of planters in those areas where underground infrastructure (Booker Creek culvert) prohibits in-ground plantings.
- 12. Increase landscape material by obtaining a landscape easement on NDDOT right-of-way.
- 13. Attempt to beautify area with landscaping around the Booker Creek culvert.



# Elevations

- 14. Oppose red building color used at the nearby Staples.
- 15. Consider an environmentally friendly color scheme that fits in with the community and resonates with the college campus.
- 16. Elevations should incorporate windows along the edge of building facing the old Southern Seasons building.
- 17. Design an outdoor seating area near headwall of Booker Creek.
- 18. Need greater transition space between the indoor/outdoor seating areas. Consider use of a landscape trellis for transitioning between indoor/outdoor activities.
