Ladies and Gentlemen:

I would like to thank the Town for your past consideration and response to requests to modify the parking regulations for Whitehead Road and Whitehead Circle. The change to Residential Permit Required has helped the situation with overwhelming parking associated with University events, but unfortunately, we continue to see many cars illegally parked between the intersection of Mason Farm and Whitehead Road and the intersection of Whitehead Road and Whitehead Circle.

As an example, there were approximately 8-10 cars illegally parked just on this short stretch of road during the basketball game on Thursday, December 28, 2006. We went out and talked to the University students manning the roadblocks into the neighborhood, and they shrugged and said they couldn't stop the cars.
