Dear Mayor Foy and Council Members,

As part of your discussion tomorrow, could some attention be paid to the character of Eubanks Road? Currently, Eubanks Road and the immediate area are being heavily impacted by governmental development. A number of these projects have been deferred until the last minute, placing a lot of stress on the governmental body(ies) to deliver. The government(s) are also in control of the development process. This dynamic has caused a number of residents of Eubanks Road to view the governmental activities with resignation.
