Dear Mr. Small:

In response to a request from Kumar Neppalli, we are removing the 30-minute parking signs on Market Street in the Southern Village.

Most of our tenants here are retail, especially in the block of the 300 Building and the block with Weaver Street Market, it would be very helpful to have rhe town install a sign that says "two hour parking" in front of the 300 building and a sign that says "one hour parking" in front of the 700 building. This is adequate time for shopping or for working out. In addition, we hope the signs would discourage longer-term users, such as employees, from using the angled parking spaces on the public street. Though we understandthat the town would not be able to provide regularenforcement of this restriction, we believe the vast majority of users would comply voluntarily.

Since these signs have been up for some time and the public has gotten used to the time limits, we would like to know if we can get approval for the 1 and 2 hour parking as soon as possible. I will assist in any way I can.

We would prefer NOT to have a one-hour parking sign right in front of the Lumina Theater. Please let us know if you need any more information, or if there are other steps we should take to

getour request accommodated.
