

Introduction

Once again it has been a very interesting year for The Peoples Channel (TPC.) The landscape of cable television franchising has changed drastically. The Video Services Act is untested and those who work in the Public, Educational, and Government Access (PEG) TV community count their blessings that they can keep their doors open, for now. The funding provisions for PEG were drastically underestimated, leaving supplemental funding for channels nearly 88% lower than expected. Municipalities across the state are misusing supplemental PEG and subscriber fee funding, and channels like TPC are trying to navigate this new landscape as best as they can. The law has yet to prove its intent, the creation of competition, with very few new providers entering the market place.

Despite the challenges, TPC has had a remarkably positive year. Local programming has risen for a third year in a row, TPC finished up it's second annual Summer Media Camp with great success, and more people walked through the doors than in the past three years. TPC's Executive Director, Chad A. Johnston was one of the proud recipients of the Independent Weekly's Citizen Award which gave the channel much needed exposure and recognition.

All of this positive growth has come with a price because TPC has grown to its capacity. The organization simply cannot expand and/or provide more programs and services without more resources: staff, equipment and facilities. The organization has committed many resources to fundraising and organizational development, but the return on capacity building has been a slow process. TPC wants to better serve the Chapel Hill community, but simply cannot do so without resources.

TPC looks forward to working with the Town to not only to understand the new cable law and its effects our citizens, but also how we can help build more technological and educational resources for the community.

A. Operation of a Public Access Studio and Editing Suites**1. Continuance of Services**

The Peoples Channel has a fully functional 2-camera television studio with most modern technical abilities, including chroma key, live call in equipment, play back/insert equipment, and character generator. TPC is also equipped with six edit bays, four of which are Mac based and two PC based.

Furthermore, TPC is equipped with a Public Internet and New Media Lab. Four computers are open to the public for internet use or other media creation. For example, Radio Pa'lante, a Latino youth radio program on WCOM (Carrboro's community radio station) uses the lab to edit their radio segments. TPC is still in the process of developing curriculum for new media courses including but not limited to blogging, video blogging, audio story telling and open source technologies, and hopes to implement these courses in the fall.

TPC is in the investigative stages of creating an online portal very similar to You Tube, but solely focused on local media production. TPC has the storage for such a venture, but not necessarily the bandwidth or infrastructure at this moment. The staff believes that working in this direction can help promote content sharing not only locally, but throughout the region and the world.

2. Staffing

The Peoples Channel is governed by a Board of Directors and operates under the following mission statement, updated in March 2007:

For a democratic society to function properly, citizens must participate in their government, be educated to think critically and be able to freely communicate their ideas. The Peoples Channel's mission is to advance democratic ideals by ensuring that people have access to electronic media and by promoting effective communication through community uses of media. Through this mission, we aim to provide the means and promote the opportunity for area citizens to exercise free speech through media production, education and distribution of cable television programming.

The primary goal of The Peoples Channel is to promote use of the designated access channel(s) by coordinating the use of the public access channel(s) and providing production facilities, and to provide technical assistance and media training to any individual, group, or organization interested in producing cultural, informational, entertainment, or educational media productions of interest to the community.

Board members are residents of Orange County or a neighboring county and serve without compensation. Officers include President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer; the President serves as Chair of the Board and the Vice President as Vice Chair. As of August 1st, 2007, there were ten members of the Board; four positions are vacant. A list of current Board members and officers appears in Attachment A.

As of August 1st, 2007 TPC was staffed with two full time employees who manage all aspects of daily station operations. TPC intends on hiring two more staff members in the following months, however due to the uncertainty of funding levels, final decisions will not be made until funding sources are clear. The staff is organized into the following positions:

- Executive Director – Chad A. Johnston
- Director of Programming/Graphic Designer/Instructor – Jeremy Taylor
- Director of Communications/Music Librarian/Instructor – Vacant
- Director of Outreach and Fundraising– Vacant

TPC also employs several part time staff members for special projects, community coverage and contracts.

- Phoenix Mangus – Assistant Director: Board of Orange County Commissioners, and Youth Media Instructor
- Cullen Jones, Dakota Marcoplos, Barbara Spivey – BOCC crew members.

TPC's daily operations are also supported by a wonderful network of volunteers. Ranging from 12-72 years of age, volunteers help with every aspect of the station's operations including programming, coverage of local events, producing the Community Bulletin Board, and data entry. TPC works formally with local high schools and their community service requirements, UNC and the APPLES program, and the RSVP program through the Senior Center. TPC currently has 113 active volunteers in its database, and could not survive without them.

3. Hours of operation

The Peoples Channel's hours are Tuesday and Thursday 2-10pm, Wednesday 1-10pm, Friday 2-9pm, and Saturday from 10:00am to 6:00pm. TPC staff are also available for additional appointments outside of those hours as they can afford.

4. Size and Equipment of Studio and Editing Facility

TPC's facility is approximately 1,600 square feet. The station currently has six field cameras, and auxiliary equipment available for check out and rental.

5. Location of Facility

The Peoples Channel is located at 300AC South Elliott Road in Chapel Hill. The organization has preformed and passed a self evaluation for ADA accessibility and is located on the D and F bus line.

B. Marketing and Promotion

Items 1-13 (B) in the Marketing and Promotion section of the Performance Agreement are carried out the following forms:

The Community Bulletin Board:

The Community Bulletin Board plays in lieu of commercials between programs and in the early morning hours. The bulletin board primarily carries Public Service Announcements (PSA's) for local community groups, government agencies and non-profit organizations. It also serves as a platform for TPC to distribute announcements about meetings, courses and schedules.

Under the new state legislation, TPC will no longer be able to cablecast as many hours of valuable community bulletin board content. In order to qualify as a PEG channel, TPC must run 8 hours of programming a day, with no more than 15% (1.2 minutes per hour) electronic bulletin board. Though this service is a wonderful benefit to the community, service announcements will primarily run in the early morning hours this coming fall.

The World Wide Web/www.thepeopleschannel.org

The Peoples Channel's web site contains information about all of our activities, including but not limited to, courses, fees, policies and procedures, examples of programs, and program schedule. TPC is still developing an open source content management system to expand its website which will enable the organization to have a more active online community.

Email Listserv

TPC moderates an email listserv, which is open to the public and accessible by signing up at the station or on the web site. The listserv functions as a communications tool for anyone interested in The Peoples Channel's activities. The listserv is used by producers, volunteers, and the general public for discussion purposes, and also as an aid to find crew members and/or production support. It is also used by the staff to announce policy changes, event reminders, and volunteer opportunities. The list currently has 636 community members subscribed.

Local Press

The Peoples Channel's schedule is published in the Chapel Hill News weekly. It continues to partner with the Independent Weekly and its Indy Allies section, which highlights local community groups and nonprofits. TPC is also linked from many local web sites and had much more press in the last year because of its work organizing around the Video Service Competition Act.

Mailings

The Peoples Channel distributes at least two mailings a year: one to local organizations, and one to our members.

Seasonal Publication

TPC self-publishes a seasonal newsletter *Feedback Loop* which is distributed at various locations in the area. The publication lists courses, highlights current programs, and addresses issues of media literacy. Current and archived issues are also available on the TPC web site.

C. Public Information

All items 1-13 (B) in the Performance Agreement and any other public information regarding TPC are available to the public, either on the web site, phone conversation with a staff member, or via email or other electronic communication. All records of meetings, documents regarding local, State and Federal regulations as they relate to Public Access are available electronically or otherwise to any member of the community who wishes to access them.

The organizations Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation and Policies and Procedures were recently updated and reviewed by the UNC Law Clinic. There were no major legal issues identified, and minor adjustments were made to the Policies and Procedures.

D. Responsiveness and Openness to Citizens

During business hours, The Peoples Channel staff frequently answer questions from the community at our phone number, 919.960.0088. After hours, a voice mail system answers calls, giving callers basic information regarding staff, business hours, location and web address.

A satisfaction survey is being designed and shall be implemented by the date of this presentation. Results shall be made available to the public through our web site and summarized in the 2007-08 report. With so very few resources, it is difficult for the few staff members to create and implement a survey.

On December 9th, 2006 The Peoples Channel held a publicized open event for the community to provide feedback on its performance. This event was cablecast live, repeated 6 times and comments were open to all community members who were present in our studio. Those watching at home were able to participate via telephone. The organization received many positive comments from producers and volunteers. The event takes place annually as requested in the Performance Agreement. The next event of this kind will be held December 14th, from 6-8pm.

E. Training and Orientation

All courses offered are listed in our Course Catalog, Attachment B. Course offerings are also posted in our seasonal publication, on the web site and at the station. While the channel does not have any scholarship opportunities, TPC hopes to work with the local business community using underwriting to help with scholarship funds. For every fee, the station offers "sweat equity" equated at \$10 an hour. If a citizen cannot afford to pay for courses or fees, they can volunteer their time to work off the fee. About one half of all producers and members participate in the "sweat equity" program. TPC offers ten courses, totaling 1,368 possible course hours. In the last fiscal year, TPC taught 426 of those hours offered to the community, which is well beyond the 250 hours required in the Performance Agreement.

This summer, TPC was proud to host its second annual Summer Youth Media Camp for youth ages 13-18. Four 2 week sessions were offered in narrative production, studio concepts, documentary, and animation. This year, TPC nearly doubled its enrolment from last year with a total of 26 students. Thanks to the generous support of the Strowd Roses Foundation, TPC was able to provide nearly \$4,000 in scholarships. TPC hopes that next year the scholarship fund will be supported through the local business community.

F. Playback of Programming

The staff determines the broadcast schedule for The Peoples Channel on a first come, first served, First Amendment basis. Priority is given to locally produced

programming from the franchise area. This includes programs produced using The Peoples Channel facilities as well as other locally produced or compiled programs. Second priority is given to non-local programs submitted by local residents. Whenever time slots are not otherwise filled, TPC carries reruns of programs from TPC's archive or other programs deemed appropriate by the staff. Two weeks of programming samples are located in Attachment C. Program totals, equipment use and visitor and volunteer information are located in Attachment D.

Programs are scheduled in 6-hour blocks that run in the evening 6pm-Midnight and are normally repeated the following morning, 6am-Noon and afternoon, Noon-6pm. The Saturday evening schedule runs through Monday afternoon, due to the facility being closed on Sunday and Monday. The Peoples Channel's Bulletin Board runs after late night programming (times vary depending on the schedule) and 6 a.m. and between programs where appropriate. Programs that are inappropriate for younger audiences are scheduled to run only after 11pm.

TPC is still in the process of upgrading its equipment to a fully digital format. Given staff size and resources, it has taken the organization much longer than anticipated to implement this upgrade. TPC is currently programming a few hours a day digitally, and hopes to be fully integrated this Fall. The station's scheduling will change slightly due to the upgrade. Programs will only repeat in two 6 hour cycles; Noon-6pm and 6pm-Midnight. From 6am-Noon, TPC will cablecast our Community Bulletin Board and audio cablecast the Triangle Reading Service in an effort to better serve the senior and visually impaired community.

G. Citizen Comment and Programming

The Peoples Channel attempts to provide spaces for soapbox opportunities, however due to a small staff, this can be difficult to accomplish. However, TPC is still trying to formalize possible dates and volunteer crews for soapbox opportunities. When this becomes formalized, it will be publicized to the community at large.

H. Live Programming

The Peoples Channel currently has no live programming.

I. Priority for Chapel Hill Residents in Public Access Services Funded through the Town

As reflected in our course fees, we give priority to Chapel Hill residents. Residents outside of the Franchising area pay \$10 more per course.

J. Non-Involvement of the Town in Programming Decisions

To this date, TPC has had no programming suggestions or demands from the Town of Chapel Hill with the exceptions of airing Public Service Announcements provided by the

Town. We have cooperated with the Town when citizen complaints about TPC's programming have been directed to the Town.

K. Other Agreements Regarding Public Access Services in Orange County and the Triangle Region

The Peoples Channel has entered into a new agreement with Orange County to cover their government meetings for their new Government Access Channel 265. TPC also provides other services outside of meeting coverage, such as station monitoring, technical consulting and trouble shooting.

The organization is still working to get The Peoples Channel cablecasting in Carrboro.

L. Fees

Since the last Annual Report to the Town, only one change in fees has been made. Course fees across the board were raised \$10. Fees have not been raised in two years, and given the need for more resources, the staff and board deemed this appropriate. TPC's membership and user fees are still at the same levels. Membership policies are:

Access facilities, equipment, technical assistance, and channel time or bandwidth are available to certified members. Members may become certified after passing a training course(s) or through alternative certification by staff. A \$25 annual membership fee shall be applied to any individual member. A \$100 annual membership fee shall be applied to any organization or community group, allowing for a maximum of six individuals associated with the organization or group to be members. A \$225 annual membership fee shall be applied to any public, private or charter school, allowing for a maximum of 15 individuals associated with the school to be members. A \$10 annual membership fee shall be applied for those individuals wishing to only use the New Media Lab or public internet lab. A \$50 membership fee shall be applied for an organization or community group who wish to only use the New Media Lab or public internet lab, allowing for six individuals associated with the organization. A \$100 membership fee shall be applied for schools who wish to only use the New Media Lab or public internet lab, allowing for 15 individuals associated with the school.

Anyone using The Peoples Channel facilities or equipment in any shape or form must be a member.

Any individual member can be one of the following:

- 1. A television program producer*
- 2. A television program submitter*
- 3. One of an organization's television program submitters/ television program crew members/ television program producers*
- 4. One of a school's television program submitters/ television program crew members/ television program producers*
- 5. A user of the public internet lab*
- 6. A user of the New Media Lab*
- 7. One of an organizations users of the public internet lab*
- 8. One of an organizations users of the New Media Lab*

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The annual membership fee shall be included in any course fee. Anytime a member takes a course, their membership shall renew on that course date. If a member does not need to take a course in order to use equipment or facilities, then the membership fee needs to be resolved before equipment or facilities can be used. Any individual may volunteer, pay or opt out of the membership fee based on need. The membership fee is collected to support general operations of the station, help defray the cost of depreciation and as a mechanism for keeping a current and updated member database.

The Peoples Channel will not sell, distribute or otherwise give out member's information except that information which members choose to make available to the public. Members who cablecast programs must make available some form of contact information to enable the public to respond to the television producer's program. It is the member's responsibility to make sure that their information is up to date. Intentionally providing incorrect information may result in suspension.

Members must prove residency with one or more of the following documents:

- 1. NC photo driver's license*
- 2. NC photo non-driver's license*
- 3. Out-of-State photo driver's license*
- 4. U.S. Passport*
- 5. Foreign Passport*
- 6. Resident Alien Card (Green Card)*
- 7. Major credit card with a photo along with original social security card*
- 8. Welfare/Medicaid card with photo along with original social security card*

Acceptable forms of proof of residency:

- 1. A recent utility bill in the applicant's name with current address*
- 2. A recent bank statement in the applicant's name with current address*

Any person who has not used The Peoples Channel's equipment for a 12-month period will have to be re-certified by demonstrating competency in the operation of that equipment, and resolve the annual membership fee. If a member cannot demonstrate competency, they must become re-certified. It is entirely up to the staff to discrepancy whether or not the member has to become re-certified.

M. Coordination with Time Warner Cable

TPC makes every effort to coordinate with Time Warner Cable. However, TWC considers The Peoples Channel to be a competitor, which can make coordination and positive communication complicated.

N. Signal Quality on Public Access Channel(s)

TPC makes reasonable efforts to ensure that community producers submit broadcast quality programs, however because TPC does not pre-screen programs there is no absolute guarantee of program standards. It is station policy to pull programs after they are aired if there is a technical or content issue. TPC's new digital broadcast server should greatly increase signal quality.

Conclusion

The next time The Peoples Channel will report to the town, the organization will have reached its ten year anniversary. The organization has made it through many struggles, but in the face of adversity, it has held its ground and grown well beyond what its founders could have imagined. The organization still faces challenges; many of them more serious than ever before. It is however, the opinion of the Board of Directors and staff that the organization can continue to grow and flourish despite the challenges.

The Peoples Channel exists because the Chapel Hill community demanded that Public Access Television be facilitated by a community organization that was receptive to the community's needs. The Town, in its commitment to democratic processes and community participation, listened to its citizens and helped to create this truly unique community organization.

The Peoples Channel continues to forge its way into the future, and the organization hopes to have the same level of support and understanding of the community's desires to support this unique community resource. It is the hope that the Town and The Peoples Channel can continue to work closely, as both entities work towards ensuring the Chapel Hill community has the best access to technology, education and community resources.

Productions that are made outside of a television studio are called "on-location" or "field" shoots. Then, an one-time, hands-on course that explains how to edit on iMovie, learn how to capture, splice, manipulate and export video and sound for a television show, an independent movie and/or those home-movies that clutter the shelves.

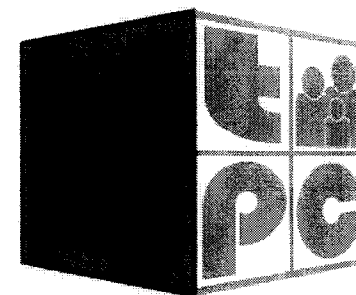

We start by creating a script, transfer it to storyboards, then record voices. Next, we design our characters and backgrounds. After that, we use the computer to assemble the story, add sound-effects, and music with titles/credits. Finally, the animated story is burned to DVD. First session is instructional and the remaining nine sessions are tutored hands-on productions.

Adobe Aftereffects
