The Town Council of Chapel Hill will hold a public hearing at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 7, in the Council Chamber of Town Hall, 405 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., to consider the following:

Public Forum on Potential Adjustment to the Cable Public Access Charge

Public input is welcomed as the Council considers the supplemental public access fee (now 78 cents per month) for cable television. The cable television franchise allows the Town to have cable customers billed a public access fee. The public access fee charges are collected by Time Warner Cable and then turned over to the Town for operation of The Peoples Channel. Under the cable franchise, the Town Council each year must decide whether to reduce, eliminate or increase the public access fee.

Leaf Collection Begins Oct. 22

The Town has begun its annual leaf collection. Residents may place loose leaves and pine straw that are free of limbs and debris at the curb. Leaf piles should not block roadways, bike lanes, sidewalks, fire hydrants, water meters, mail boxes, storm drains, and utility boxes, or interfere with sight distances at intersections.
