Dear Ms. Stidham:

Thank you for your application for a FY 2007 federal Historic Preservation Fund grant through the North Carolina State Historic Preservation Office (HPO), Division of Historical Resources, Office of Archives and History. The Historic Preservation Fund is administered by the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior, in partnership with state and local governments.

This year the HPO received nineteen applications from local applicants requesting a total of \$157,447 in grant funds. However, only \$68,600 was available for Certified Local Governments and no funds were available for non-certified local governments to meet the important preservation needs outlined in the applications.

The FY 2007 applications involved many projects of very high quality, and competition was keen. We would like nothing better that to be able to award grants to all of the applicants. However, the level of the federal allocation and continued state budget constraints make that impossible this year. As a result, your project was not among those that were selected to receive grant assistance in 2007.

We are disappointed that we cannot fund a greater number of worthwhile proposals, but perhaps you can find another funding source to accomplish the goals of your project. Besides county and city funding programs and donations from local organizations, many communities and groups have solicited funds from foundations, individuals, and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation has posted an excellent web site on sources of grant funds at www.achp.gov.
