Develop a Financial Plan




Long Range Transit Plan Summary

Recommendations

- Utilized population, employment, travel data from adopted Regional plan
- Vision of Transit system in 2035
- Framework within which town can respond to future development and growth
- Major transportation corridors gateways
 - A higher order of transit
 - Expanded Express Bus, Light Rail, Bus Rapid Transit

Long Range Transit Plan Summary

- Recommendations related to Carolina North
 - LRTP included assumptions about Carolina North
 - Bus Rapid Transit



Bus Rapid Transit

- What is BRT ???
 - A flexible, high performance bus service that combines many characteristics of light rail including physical, operating and system elements into a permanently integrated bus system with a quality image and unique identity.





What is Bus Rapid Transit

- Characteristics
 - High capacity buses
 - High frequency service
 - Dedicated running ways
 - Route structure
 - Upgraded shelters
 - Technology
 - Easy fare payment
 - Unique identity





Transportation Impact Analysis for Carolina North

- Assess Impact of additional travel on local streets and transit
- Use the LRTP as a base
- More detailed level of analysis
 - Check assumptions
 - Short term
 - Various levels of development 800,000 sq. ft.- 3 million sq. ft.
- Data for development of Short Range Transit Plans



Short Range Transit Plan

- Will be developed to support LRTP
 - Community wide
 - Corridor specific
 - 5 7 year horizon with annual element
 - Reviewed and updated regularly
- Short Range Transit Plan and Carolina North
 - Identify services to support various levels of development
 - Support development goals
 - Incorporate into Development Agreement



Short Range Transit Plan

- Components of Short Range Transit Plan
 - Transit improvements to meet community goals/
 Development Agreement
 - Annual operating and capital costs
 - 1 year implementation plan
 - Marketing plans
 - Consistent with LRTP
 - Regular updates



Next Steps

- Long Range Transit Plan
 - May 2009 Policy Committee review and acceptance
 - June 2009 presentation to Chapel Hill/ Carrboro and UNC policy bodies
 - June / July 2009 series of public forums
 - Fall 2009 council public hearing / plan revision
 - December 2009 Council Approval of Final LRTP
- Carolina North Transportation Impact Analysis
 - May 1, 2009 complete analysis of 800,000 sq. ft.
 - May 31, 2009 Identify criteria and mechanisms for Development agreement and Short Range Transit plan
