At his time at Orange Community Land and Trust he was instrumental in overseeing that affordable housing be developed in Meadowmont. Eric was very involved in the community and could often be found biking out to work while employed at the Emerson Waldorf School to save energy and the environment. Eric helped to start the Thursday evening music events at Weaver Street and was inspired to help support Weaver Street in becoming the center of Carrboro. He was a Guardian et Litem and mentored many children through that program. He was committed to making his life and this world a better place to live in.

His partner, Laura Dominkovic who lived in Carrboro with Eric before settling in Asheville, NC wanted to have something in town to honor him that his friends and community can come and visit. The Bolin Creek trail in Chapel Hill is paved so it is accessible to many people, and we contacted them to inquire about planting a tree and placing a plaque in memory of Eric. I met with Bill Webster at Parks and Recreation and he and I picked an appropriate spot for the tree to be planted and he informed me to have a plaque the town needs to vote and make a decision at a Town Council meeting. We will be providing and paying for the plaque. We would like to gather the weekend of September 26th, 2009 when Eric's partner, his sister, parents, and friends want to plant the tree and reflect on how our lives have been touched by Eric. We would like the plaque to say:
