

My family and I have been bike and pedestrian route users in Chapel Hill since we moved here in 1985. My husband Mark, commuted every day by bike until he started telecommuting from home two years ago. When he goes into RTP for meetings he still rides his bike or runs and takes the TTA. My two sons, have ridden their bikes and walked around town, without a car and still, at ages 25 and 26, transport themselves without using a car in Raleigh, Boone, and here in Chapel Hill. My 83 year old mother just moved to Carrboro and expects to be able to get around without a car using the bus service and walking as she can not longer drive. I have used the Bolin Creek trail and various route to get to and from UNC by walking, bus and bike over the 10 year period it took for me to get my Communications Studies degree (Biology minor) part time. My family travels to the library by walking and biking, we walk down to our local restaurants at least once a week, and also walk and bike for pleasure.

My college education (1978-1981) was in Landscape Architecture and planning at University of Madison, WI. I am familiar with map reading, surveying, and landscape design issues. As a gardener, I am familiar with water and erosion issues, so I also have a general education in urban geography, planning, landscape history and design. There was a period of my life, about three years, when I had to get around using a walker and wheel chair, before and after knee replacement. I now use an electric assist bike and I am back to walking to restaurants with my husband so I am familiar with handicap accessibility issues.

We have adopted either the bike or walking, or the bus service and our family does them all whenever possible. However, we still have to use the car at night, for heavy loads, and for longer trips. I have to use a truck or car to carry heavy goods from Lowes and the grocery store.

We also still have a number of issues with bike and ped transport in town: accessibility, visibility and safety, noise, weather, micro climate, and shaded routes, bench, food, and water stops, and adjunct services, like bike repair. I am thinking that grocery stores and other stores could facilitate pedestrian and bike access by providing free delivery services. I have been an advocate for ped, bike, and bus transportation for many years.

A conflict of interest or a potential conflict occurs if a member has a separate, private, or monetary interest, either direct or indirect, in any issue or transaction under consideration. Any member who violates this provision may be subject to removal from the board or commission.

If the advisory board or commission member believes he/she has a conflict of interest then that member should ask the advisory board or commission to be recused from voting. The advisory board or commission should then vote on the question on whether or not to excuse the member making the request. In cases where the individual member or the advisory board or commission establishes a conflict of interest, then the advisory board or commission member shall remove themselves from the voting area.

Any advisory board or commission member may seek the counsel of the Town Attorney on questions regarding the interpretation of these ethics guidelines or other conflict of interest matters. The interpretation may include a recommendation on whether or not the advisory board or commission member should excuse himself/herself from voting. The advisory board or commission member may request the Town Attorney respond in writing.
