Petition Requesting Residential Parking Permit Ordinance for Colonial Heights Michael Collins, 723 Williams Circle, Chapel Hill, NC 27516, 967-4119

Dear Mayor Kleinschmidt and Town Council:

I am petitioning you tonight in regard to an increasing on-street parking problem we are having in our neighborhood. This is not the first time I have come before you on this matter.

Our neighborhood is located just south of Estes Drive (see map), and comprises roughly the streets of Bradley Road, Williams Circle, Lea Court, and a bit of Severin Street.

Some months ago, in response to a letter from Todd Shapley-Quinn (see attached), you enacted an ordinance establishing parking on Branch Street and Justice Street by residential permit only. This was to address a problem of UNC employees parking on those narrow streets and walking up to Airport Drive to the UNC facilities in order to avoid having to use the park and ride lots. In his letter, Mr. Shapley-Quinn pointed out that UNC assured residents that UNC employees would not park in our neighborhood after the new UNC Business Office was built on Airport Drive.

Your action resolved the problem for Branch and Justice Streets. Unfortunately, those individuals have simply moved one block over and are now parking along Bradley Road and Severin Street, and in some cases on Williams Circle. Over the last year or two, we have seen the number of cars increase from 3-4 to 11+ (see photos). It is generally the same vehicles, and anyone who cares to come watch at around 8 a.m. will see the individuals leaving their cars and walking toward Airport Drive or to one of the bus stops.

The numerous parked cars on Bradley make it very difficult for people to see traffic coming down Bradley Road as they move from Severin on to Bradley Rd.

In addition, our neighborhood has many young families with small children who regularly walk this area during the day, and many others who walk to catch the bus. We have no sidewalks in our neighborhood. The parked cars narrow the road severely, particularly if a bus happens to be traveling up Bradley Road (A Route).

It should be noted that we petitioned the town several years ago for relief concerning this and other related problems. However, the traffic engineers set a very large boundary for our area that included a large area of Elkin Hills. In the end, because of absentee landlords and other issues, we were unable to gather the large number of necessary signatures.

We respectfully request that this time the boundary include only the properties along Bradley Road, Williams Circle, and Lea Court, and the residences on Severin Street that are in Colonial Heights.



Dear Mr. Neppalli,

This is in follow-up to our earlier conversations about UNC employees parking along streets in the neighborhood behind the UNC buildings on Airport Drive. Several years ago, when this newest building was first being discussed in public session with the Town Council, UNC representatives made it very clear that UNC employees would NOT be parking on the side streets. Nevertheless, that is what continues to happen. I understand that you have taken this up with UNC's Assistant Director for Transportation, but there has been no improvement.

This is problematic because these streets (Branch St. and Justice St.) are neither intended nor designed for parking along the edges. When the employees do park there, the remaining space is too narrow for cars coming in opposite directions to pass each other. Moreover, some of the parked cars are consistently pulled over far enough that they are partially on the lawns of the local residents.

I've talked with some of our neighbors about this issue and they are in agreement that this is a problem, including the resident on the corner of Branch and Justice who is most affected.

We would like to see UNC follow through on their assurances. If they are unable or unwilling to do this, we would like the Town of Chapel Hill to designate and post both Branch St. and Justice St. as "parking for residents only."
