Issues Raised:

• The Board emphasized the need for sufficient notification of prospective home buyers over the long term, and supported the stipulation in Resolution A calling for documents to be recorded which would alert home buyers as to the proximity of the site to the transit corridor easement.

• The Board requested that staff to research the verbiage on current signs, and that the staff and developer coordinate with Triangle Transit on the wording of the new notification signs.

SUMMARY OF COMMUNITY DESIGN COMMISSION ACTION

Subject: Murray Hill Special Use Permit

Recommendation: That the Council adopts Resolution B, (Resolution to Deny) included as

Attachment 3 to the February 17, 2010 Staff Report, for the following

reasons:

1. Too Much Density for the Site: The site is too tight for the amount of building proposed. The Commission stated that no pattern of density exists along Meadowmont Lane (in either direction) that makes the proposed density appropriate. They believe the development would "stick out like a sore thumb" along the gateway entrance to Meadowmont. Reduction in the number of dwelling units was recommended but the applicant was unwilling to reduce the number for the reason that it would be infeasible to construct with less dwelling units.

Most Commissioners supported retaining more trees on the site in exchange for less building.

2. <u>Traffic Safety</u>: Both vehicular and pedestrian traffic movements are unsafe. Residents south of the proposed Meadowmont Lane median curb cut wanting to turn left will be going way out of their way to go north or make unsafe U-turns on Meadowmont Lane.

Pedestrian residents from The Cedars Retirement Center using the Meadowmont Lane crosswalk will be crossing very close the driveway entrance/exit proposed for seven of the units, creating potential unsafe pedestrian/vehicular interaction.
