Dear Committee Member:

Greetings! Thank you for your service as a member of Chapel Hill's Special Committee to Consider the Renaming of Airport Road. We look forward to meeting you in person and working with you this coming Friday and Saturday. This letter covers all the details you will need to know to participate fully in this important dialogue.

Based on what we read in your applications to be part of the committee as well as from conversations with many of you (we hope to speak with each of you individually by this week), we envision that our time together will lead to three outcomes:

- 1. Constructive dialogue across lines of difference
- 2. Greater understanding of each other's needs and interests
- 3. Collective decision making on recommendations to the Town Council by its December 6 meeting

Please arrive by 8:00 for registration and coffee. Our process will begin promptly at 8:30 each morning. We will end no later than 4:00 each day, earlier if possible.

While we will provide greater detail when we meet, we offer the following descriptions of two of the tools we will use to advance the dialogue:

- Kiva Conversation The Kiva is a structured way to have a difficult conversation. It comes from a
 Native American tradition that allows all members of a community to have their voices heard in a
 conversation without regard to the amount of power they hold in the community.
- Caucuses In our experience helping multicultural groups gain deeper trust and shared commitment, we have learned that periods of intentional separation are critical to authentic integration. We will begin Day 2 with white people and people of color meeting in two different groups or "caucuses." You will have the opportunity to share your reflections on Day 1 and to talk openly with each other about other feelings you have. This process allows people to be open and to express things that are still difficult to share in an interracial discourse. It also allows space for each group to challenge itself to grow in understanding and courage for further discourse.

Meeting Location

We will be meeting both days at the Courtyard Marriott across from the Friday Center in Chapel Hill. Find driving directions at http://marriott.com/property/property/page/RDUCH or by calling 919-883-0700. We are scheduled to be in the Winston Room, but look for signs to be sure. We will be at the same hotel for our half-day follow-up meeting on November 20 (tentatively scheduled for 8:30-noon; we will confirm at the end of our time together this weekend).

What to Wear/Bring

Please dress casually and comfortably. Hotel rooms are notoriously too hot or too cold, so bring a jacket or sweater. We will provide all meeting materials.
