

Downtown Merchant Survey

In late and July and early August, 2003 Parks and Recreation Department hand distributed surveys downtown businesses regarding the Town's street fairs to forty (40) merchants. 75% (29) responded to the survey. A copy of the survey and results are included with this memo. While merchants seem to agree the street fairs represent the community, results also indicate that 58% of those surveyed believed the street fairs attract business to the downtown district. However, results differ on whether the business attracted is a profitable business, showing an even spilt of 41% disagree with the notion there is profitable business generated by the fairs, while 48% support the notion of increased business and profits.

62% of the businesses responding to the survey are retail, while 38% are either service or hospitality oriented.

86% remain indicated that they remain open during the street fairs.

With regards to the event layout, 86% supported the idea of vendor booths placed back to back down the center of Franklin Street.

Arts & Crafts are considered the most successful component of the fair, while the community aspect of the events ran a close second. 43% of those surveyed have attended the street fairs 8 years or more. 55% of those surveyed support a change in location while 45% indicated a desire that the location remain on Franklin Street.


University Mall




Do you think the street fairs support downtown businesses and merchants?




Do you feel the street fairs bring business to the Downtown Chapel Hill area?



Are your interests represented in the street fairs?




Do you feel the street fairs accurately represent the Chapel Hill community?







Do you feel the street fairs events positively impact the local economy?



What type of business do you own and/or operate?




If the fair offered a "Taste of Chapel Hill" Food Court, would you participate as a food vendor in the fair?






Do you support a layout where vendor booths are centered in the middle of the street, leaving the sidewalks in front of merchant businesses open?




Are you open for business on the day of a street fair event?





Which component do you think best represent the street fairs?







How many years have you attended Chapel Hill's street fairs?




How do you rate this past years' (2003 Apple Chill) street fair?
