On August 25, 2003, the Chapel Hill Town Council accepted a petition from the WoodGlen Homeowners' Association "to address a serious traffic problem that has developed along East Longview Street."

On September 16, 2003, the Columbia Place Homeowners' Association Board of Directors unanimously agreed to notify the Town Council of our similar concerns and to let you know that we support the WoodGlen HOA petition to eliminate parking from their driveway at 130 E. Longview to Airport Road.

The parked SUVs, trucks and cars near the intersection of E. Longview and N. Columbia Street make it difficult for residents leaving Columbia Place, as there is limited turning room. The left turn is further complicated by the speed of many vehicles driving down E. Longview to Airport Road.

This change will enhance safety for our residents. Thank you for your consideration.
