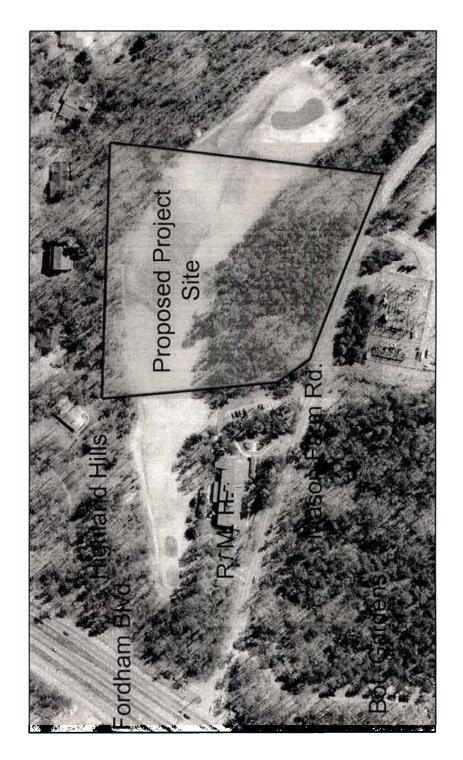
The Family House at UNC Hospitals is to be constructed on 5.85 acres of University of North Carolina leased property adjacent to the Ronald McDonald House on Mason Farm Road. This 26,000 square foot, two-story facility will eventually serve up to 40 families. We understand the Town's ordinance controlling a residential support facility only allows service to 30 families, and we will be requesting the Town Council approve a modification to this ordinance to allow for a 10-family increase. This facility will be planned and operated very similarly to the Ronald McDonald House, with the exception that the families being served will have adult family members at the Hospital as patients. 53 parking spaces are planned around the side of the facility. Most of the visitors to this facility will park their vehicles and ride the Hospital Shuttle back and forth to the Hospital.

This facility is planned to have a strong residential feeling to it, from the design of the exterior throughout the interior. Specific design guidelines are as follows:

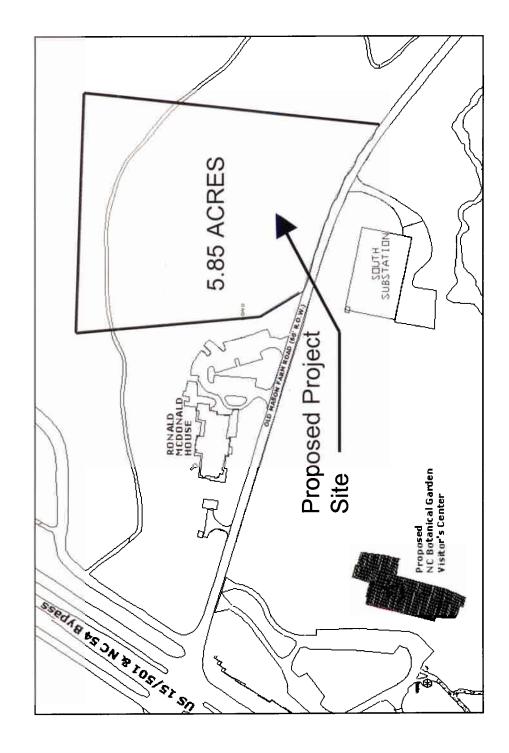
- 1. Minimize paving materials and locate parking areas around the sides of the property, utilizing the natural contour lines of the lot. A large existing treed buffer will be left along Mason Farm Road to provide screening of the parking area.
- 2. Maintain and enhance natural buffers on all sides of the facility.
- 3. Storm water management will be provided by various methods from porous pavement to rain gardens to containment basins. Reuse of storm water for irrigation is also being considered. However, the use of native, drought-resistant plants may not require irrigation.
- 4. This site has a manageable slope upward from Mason Farm Road to the rear of the site, which will be dealt with by a set of accessible ramps/stairs, variable finished floor heights and terracing of garden areas.
- 5. Neighborhood review meetings will be held periodically to receive the neighbor's comments and address concerns.
- 6. This facility will be designed with energy and resource conservation as a priority. The Triangle J High Performance Building Standards will be followed, under the supervision of a LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified designer.
