Issues Raised:

1) The process and revisions associated with this application are confusing.

- 2) Several board members were uncomfortable that the amount of floor area they were authorized to approve was less than the applicant needed for the project.
- 3) Several Board members believe that the zoning for this site should have reverted from the existing Residential-3-Conditional back to Residential-2 (R-2), when the former Village Oaks Assisted Living facility Special Use Permit expired.
- 4) One Board member believed that the hotel was too tall for this site.

Explanation of Dissenting Vote(s):

The dissenting members noted the following reasons for their dissenting votes:

- The proposed hotel is one of the better uses for this site. Based on the location of the site, this is an ideal commercial location for a conditional use.
- The proposed buffers for the hotel proposal are good for the surrounding neighborhoods.
