Speed calming devices on Lonebrook Drive

Hi Kumar,

I met today with several members of our homeowner's association board and discussed the speeding problem on Lonebrook Drive in our neighborhood. I reviewed all the speed survey data that you gave me when we met in early December. I also shared your recommendation for installing two multi-way stop signs (at the intersections of Lonebrook/Tremont closest to Weaver Dairy Rd. ext and Lonebrook/Glenmore) and three speed humps (between the two Tremont intersections with Lonebrook, between the Tremont and Glenmore intersections and between the Kenilworth and Juliette intersections).

As a group, we decided to accept your recommendations with no changes. I could not remember which type of speed hump you recommended (parabolic, flat-top, etc.) but we will accept whichever type you feel is appropriate. We would like you to proceed with the next step towards obtaining the necessary approvals to implement the plan. Your proposal to the town on January 13 regarding neighborhood contributions toward the installation of speed humps may impact what we ultimately do but we felt it in our best interest to formally request action prior to the town council's decision.
