Dear Town Council:

We, the residents of the eastend of Burning Tree Dr. would like to make the Town Council aware of a traffic situation that has persisted inspite of speed humps installed recently to calm the traffic on the above named street.

Many drivers coming from NC54 maintain a speed that is much above the posted 25mph till they hit the speed hump at 1110 Burning Tree Dr. These drivers don't slow down enough, and the front end of the car will hit the pavement with such impact as to leave a scar on it. Drivers going toward NC54 very often accelerate above 25mph so they can make up for lost time going over previous speed humps.

Therefore, the residents of the last stretch of Burning Tree Dr. would like to recommend that the Town Council authorize the installation of one more speed hump at approximately 1131 Burning Tree Drive. This, we feel, would conclude the traffic calming process and avoid possible accidents, especially in the summer months when children play outdoors.
