to call on the Wrights, & ask of him a
report of the proceeds of tithing for the
year 1869 & to the present date of 1870,
and to pay over half the proceeds arising
therefrom, otherwise he will take charge
of the scales - & report his proceedings
at the next meeting - Carried.

On motion (there being no question being)
the Board adjourned to meet Saturday
Evening next -

(Mr. Rufus Clark) was allowed eleven & one-
half per cent. on collections & disbursements.

On motion, Solomon Pool was allowed
ten dollars for the printing of 100
Copies of the Charter of Village of
Chapel Hill.

On motion, The Board adjourned to meet
on the last Saturday in October 1870, &
on every succeeding last Saturday
of the month thereafter.
