On motion of Dr A.B. Robinson, it was ordered that his Honor the Mayor, Mr. Check be required to take the tax list for Chapel Hill, at the time of taking the State and County lists.

On motion of L.J. Weaver, Mayor Check was authorized to rent the east room of the Kenan office, on Franklin Street, at a cost not to exceed one dollar and fifty cents per month, with the privilege of keeping it to the end of this year.

Chapel Hill Sept. 24, 1880

The Commissioners met at the office of his honor the Mayor. Present the Mayor and Coms. Weaver, Mason, Mangum, Roberson and the clerk -

Dr Mangum moved that the new tax be laid at 20 cents on the hundred dollars, and sixty cents on the poll. Carried.

Dr Mangum moved that a committee of two be appointed to receive bids for putting the town well, near the Brick Store, in good condition. The motion was carried.

Dr Mangum moved that the fees of W. C. Cull for work in May ~~for~~ to an amount of \$10.00 and for police duty, 2 days and nights, 3 and 4th of June, be allowed. Carried.

Dr Roberson moved that a fee of John G. Null April 26, 27, 28, for work on streets, amounting to \$2.62, be allowed. Carried.

Dr Roberson offered his resignation as Commissioner. Com. Mason moved that the resignation of Dr Roberson be accepted. Dr Mangum moved that the motion be laid on the table. The latter motion was carried.

The Board then adjourned

Chapel Hill Nov. 1, 1880

The Board met at the Mayor's office - Present his honor, the Mayor, Commissioners Jas. B. Mason, J. J. Weaver and A. B. Roberson.

Commissioner Roberson was appointed secy pro tempore.

It was ordered that the official Bonds of the Treasurer and Constable be referred to the Finance Committee, and that their action shall be final, and, upon their approval, the same shall be filed with the secretary, and of their action the Mayor shall be notified.

Ordered that, upon the approval of the official Bonds of the Treasurer and Constable, his honor the Mayor is hereby ordered to direct the secretary to turn over the tax-list to the Constable, for immediate collection, take his receipt therefor.

Ordered that the absent Commissioner and secretary be fined fifty cents for absence.

Com. Sparrow and the Secretary now making their appearance, Dr Roberson moved that the fines against these gentlemen be remitted. Carried.

Com. Weaver tendered his resignation as a Commissioner.

Dr Roberson moved that his resignation be accepted, so take effect at the time of the next regular meeting. Carried.

Dr Roberson nominated S. R. Thompson to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Weaver. He also placed in nomination the name of Jas. F. Craig. Both nominations were seconded by Com. Sparrow.

Com. Roberson moved that the Board now take a vote on the nominations. Seconded by Com. Sparrow.

Com. Mason moved as a substitute, that the Board do not go into an election to fill the vacancy caused by Mr. Weaver's resignation, until the next regular meeting. Seconded by Com. Weaver.
