Chapel Hill Nov 9, 1880

Board was called together to day in special
session. Present - the Mayor and
Com^rs Mongum, Weaver, Robison, Mason.
On motion of Com^r Mongum it was ordered
that the Board do hereby condemn the land
within the corporate limits of Chapel Hill, ne-
cessary for the proper extension of the streets that
are now open, and that may be necessary
for the opening of such streets as may be
required for the convenience of the citizens, as in-
dicated by the present plot of the town; and that
the Street Committee be instructed to proceed at once
to carry out this action of the Board.

Dr Robison presented an ac^e of J. G. of
Orange County, for boarding of John R.
Clements, while confined there, amounting
to \$540 - approved by the Street Committee.

This ac^e was allowed by the board.
On motion of Prof. Mongum, it was ordered
that the Street Committee be directed to make
application to the Com^r authorized to sell the
University Lands, to donate to the town an
acre or more of land, for a site for a Town
Guard-house.
