Board of Aldermen met at 8:30 A.M.
All were present. Mayor J. C. McRae Jr presiding
After the reading the minutes of last meeting
The following resolution was offered. (i)

(i) Resolve that the ordinances of the town of Chapel Hill, be and the same are hereby declared, in force in the region, extending half a mile beyond the present town limits as provided for in the revised Charter.

(ii) Resolve that no liveryman driver or other agent of any livery stable or public carrier of passengers shall go between the line of posts set up by the Southern Railway Company at the Chapel Hill station and the railway track on the arrival of the incoming trains, unless especially asked for by a given passenger, nor shall he cry out or call out in soliciting passengers in a loud or boisterous manner, And anyone violating this ordinance shall on conviction of the same be fined the sum of two dollars (\$2.00) for each and every offence.

(iii) + Resolve that no person shall deposit within that portion of the town of Chapel Hill within which, at the present time no hog pens are allowed, after July 1st 1901. No person shall deposit on or in the ground within said limits any fecal matter accumulating about any privy or closet nor shall this matter be allowed to remain at or about any privy for a time longer than seven days during the months from April the first to October inclusive nor for a longer time than 15 day during the months from November to March inclusive and the limits from which hog pens are excluded, and within which no privy refuse is allowed to be deposited, is hereby extended westward to a line parallel to and passing through the street North of Mr D. McCauley's residence. That anyone violating this ordinance shall upon
