Moved that the Board authorize the finance Committee to purchase for the town of Chapel Hill a hook and ladder outfit for fire protection, the same to cost not exceeding \$2000. The finance committee is also authorized to provide a suitable place for keeping this hook and ladder outfit and the two reels & hose to be supplied by the University a part of the fire protection outfit for the joint use of the town and the University.

+ Moved that the ordinance relative to the conveying of slops on the streets and side walks of the town do not apply to the streets and sidewalks north of Rosemary Street. No further business on motion the Board adjourned.

Oct 7<sup>th</sup> 1901

## Regular Meeting:

Board of Aldermen met at the Mayor's office at 9:30 o'clock A.M., Mayor McRae presiding. Present, A.A. Klutzy, W.S. Roberson, W.W. Pickard, and John Ward.

Minutes of the special meeting were read and approved. On motion the following ordinance was adopted: The Board of Aldermen of Chapel Hill do Ordain: (1) That in accordance with section No. 74 of the act to amend, revise and consolidate the Charter of the Town of Chapel Hill, Chapter No. 283, Private laws of 1899, the following boundaries be and the same are hereby established as fire limits:

From a point on Rosemary Street one hundred feet West of Columbia Street running parallel one hundred feet West of Columbia Street to College Avenue. On the West, College Avenue and the University Campus on the South; Rosemary Street on the North; and Raleigh Street on the East.

(2) That within said limits all buildings hereafter to be erected shall be of fire proof material, and no wooden building or shingle roof shall hereafter be erected within the same, except upon special permit granted by the Mayor, with the consent of the Board of Aldermen.

(3) That an inspection committee shall be annually appointed by the Board of Aldermen, to consist of the Mayor and two members of the Board of Aldermen. And no house shall be erected upon lots within said fire limits until the plans of the same shall be submitted to said Committee and approved by it.

(4) That this ordinance shall not apply to the ordinary repair of buildings now standing upon said lots, but in case any house within said limits shall be partially destroyed by fire, the plans of repair shall be submitted to said committee and no repairs of said buildings shall be made

except either the consent of said committee.

(5) That any person who shall violate this Ordinance by the erection of any wooden building within said limits or the repair of any building which repair is not in accord with a permit granted by the said Committee, shall forfeit and pay to the town of Chapel Hill a penalty of \$5.00 per day for each and every day in which said building shall remain in said limits, to be collected as other penalties prescribed by the ordinances of this town, are collected.

(6) This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its ratification.

Ratified Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> 1901

On motion a committee of two, the Mayor and W.S. Roberson, be appointed to look into the license tax, in regards to students selling goods in Chapel Hill. The following bills were allowed Dr. Mangum \$1.50 Dr. Galtis \$3.00 for services.

Mayor \$10.00 for taking & listing the taxes for 1901. There being no further business on motion the Board adjourned
