It was moved and seconded that a Cemetery Committee, consisting of three members of the Board be appointed by the Mayor, whose duty it shall be to have charge of the cemetery, to see that it is properly cleaned off and kept in good order, and that the committee have the use of the town team and hands for this purpose.

Motion was carried and the mayor appointed on the committee, W. W. Pickard.
