Special call meeting.  
Board of Aldermen met at 8:30 o'clock P.M.  
Mayor W.S. Roberson presiding. The following  
Aldermen present J.C. MacRae, D. McCauley  
Prof. J.W. Gore, W.A. Temple and W.W. Dickard  
Mr. Temple took oath of office.  
The Mayor asked Mr. MacRae to state the  
object of the meeting, the purpose being to  
discuss the smallpox situation.

Moved and seconded that a fence be placed  
across the walk between the D.K.E and Batt's  
Hall and a guard be employed who shall build  
the fence, subject to the approval of the  
Mayor and to guard this walkway until after  
the evening mail Thursday Jan. 19 - 1905.

Motion Carried. Moved and seconded, that the chair-  
man of the <sup>Health</sup> Committee visit all families living  
within one hundred yards of the D.K.E. Hall and that it is

the request of the Board of Aldermen that they  
be vaccinated. Motion carried. No further business  
on motion the Board adjourned.

Jan. 30 - 1905-

Mayor Office. Call meeting - Board of Aldermen  
present Prof. J.W. Gore, D. McCauley, W.A. Temple, J.C. MacRae  
Jr. and W.W. Dickard. Mayor stated that the meeting was  
called to appoint special Finance committee.

Following Committee appointed to receive reports of  
Tax Collector and of Treasurer. Prof. J.W. Gore and J.C. MacRae  
Appointed on standing Committee to fill vac.

Caused by the resignation of S.W. Andrews.

W.A. Temple street Committee also on By laws and  
Sanitary Committee. Dr E.A. Abernethy on Health Com-  
mayor then stated that another case of smallpox existed  
in Chapel Hill. Bettie Kirkland being reported sick  
moved and seconded that the house and premises on  
and in which Bettie Kirkland resides be quarantined  
Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the Mayor be empowered  
to employ physicians or physicians visit and vaccinate  
all persons subject to this ordinance providing for  
vaccination Motion carried.

Whereas it has come to the knowledge of the Mayor  
and Board of Aldermen of Chapel Hill that there is a  
case of smallpox in the town of Chapel Hill.-

It is ordained:

That all persons residing in the Town of Chapel Hill  
who have not been successfully vaccinated  
within three years just before this date shall be  
vaccinated before nine O'Clock on Saturday night,  
February 4<sup>th</sup> instant.

And it is further ordained that all or any persons who  
shall refuse to be vaccinated before said time shall  
be subject to a penalty of five dollars for each day  
after said Saturday night during which they shall  
not have been vaccinated. It is further ordained:

That the chairman of the Health Committee be directed to procure a sufficient quantity of virus and vaccinate all persons within said town who shall apply to him for vaccination.

It is provided, however, that this ordinance shall not apply to such person or persons as shall present to the Mayor a certificate signed by one of the regular practicing physicians in the Town of Chapel Hill, stating that the physical condition of said person is such that it will not permit his being vaccinated.

It is further ordained.

That on or before February 4<sup>th</sup> every person living in the Town of Chapel Hill shall deposit with the Mayor of <sup>said</sup> Chapel Hill town a certificate signed by one of the practicing physicians of the town showing that he or she has been successfully vaccinated within the time prescribed, showing date of vaccination passed. There being no further business on motion the Board adjourned.
