

That the chairman of the Health Committee be directed to procure a sufficient quantity of virus and vaccinate all persons within said town who shall apply to him for vaccination.

It is provided, however, that this ordinance shall not apply to such person or persons as shall present to the Mayor a certificate signed by one of the regular practicing physicians in the Town of Chapel Hill, stating that the physical condition of said person is such that it will not permit his being vaccinated.

It is further ordained.

That on or before February 4th every person living in the Town of Chapel Hill shall deposit with the Mayor of ^{said} Chapel Hill town a certificate signed by one of the practicing physicians of the town showing that he or she has been successfully vaccinated within the time prescribed, showing date of vaccination passed. There being no further business on motion the Board adjourned.
