On Motion it was ordered that all cars be kept off the streets during this week.

On Motion it was ordered that the making out of the car list for this year be given to Mr. A. S. Barber and that he be allowed 10.00 for same.

On Motion the following license tax was levied:

On Motion all public vehicles in use on the streets of the town of Chapel Hill shall be required to have lights, except on bright moon-light nights. Every person failing to do so shall be fined 1.00 for each offense.

On Motion B. F. Ray was exempt from paying poll tax, as he lives out of town.

Mr. Atkinson offered his resignation as Chief of Police and Tax collector.
