Sale on May 2nd 1907.

The Major appointed A.J. McRae
register for the Municipal election
to be held May 7th, 1907.

On Motion the board ratified said
appointment.

On Motion Mrs. B. Sykes and Mrs.
M. Mortimer were appointed judges
of said election.

On Motion the Quarantine ordinance
against West Chapel Hill was
repealed, provided the mayor finds county
The following ordinance was
adopted:

That no person, vaccinated or
unvaccinated, who has been an
inmate of any house infested with
small pox, be allowed within the
corporate limits of Chapel Hill
within twenty one (21) days after a
thorough fumigation of said ^{house} and
all of his or her personal belongings.
