This is to certify that at an election held in the town of Chapel Hill on the 2d day of May 1911, in accordance with an act of the General Assembly amending the charter of the town of Chapel Hill for the purpose of authorizing the town of Chapel Hill to issue bonds ^{for the construction of a sewer system} to an amount not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars, the said bonds to run and fall due at the expiration of twenty years, there were cast for the amendment a majority of the qualified votes. There being cast for the amendment one hundred and two votes, the total registered vote being one hundred and fifty eight. The result of which election is hereby certified to the Board of Aldermen of said town by the Registrar and the Judges of election.
