Gentlemen:

I have gone carefully over the condition of the ditch which runs through the property of the Bank of Chapel Hill. I have watched this ditch through the past summer. It is a breeding place for mosquitoes and as such a menace to the health of those living near. Acting under authority of Public Health Laws of 1911 I condemn the ditch. I know of only one way to remedy it--to continue the terra cotta pipe through the block. This is recommended, and it is further recommended that the town pipe be drained to beyond where Mr. Dorsett now lives. The city Engineer should be consulted as to the best means to carry out this recommendation.
