The Board of Aldermen met in called session at the Mayor's office, at 8 P.M.

Mayor Roberson presiding. Aldermen present: Messrs. Herndon, Embanks & Chubb. The following resolution offered by Mr. Herndon was adopted:

An act to amend the Charter of the town of Chapel Hill.

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

Section 1. That the Charter of the town of Chapel Hill as contained in Chapter two Hundred and eighty three of the Public Laws of One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty nine be and the same is hereby amended by substituting for the ^{words} "Upon merchandise a tax not exceeding ten dollars a year", found in section 50, Schedule B, line 11, the following words:

Upon merchandise a tax not exceeding ten dollars ~~upon~~ a year, and upon all ~~persons~~ persons, firms or corporations, or the ~~solicitors~~ soliciting agents of such persons, firms or corporations, engaged in the tailoring business, selling ~~and manufacturing~~ clothing, gents furnishings or shoes to the consumer from sample, a tax not exceeding one hundred dollars a year.

Section 2. That section 52 of the said charter be and the same is hereby amended by substituting for the words "Not exceeding ten dollars a year" as found in said section line fifteen, the following words: "Not to exceed twenty five dollars a year".

Section 3. That this act shall be in force and effect from and after its ratification.

The Board then adjourned.
