On motion, it was also ordered, that an itemized statement
of all those persons in arrears for ^{Personal, Poll,} Sewer Rent, Sanitary-Ser-
vice and Dog-Tax, be published ~~in~~ The NEWS- ~~one~~ week from
this date.

On motion, it was ordered, that the present Sewer-rent
charged against the Chapel Hill Graded School- be remitted
and that no further charge for rent be made against the
Graded School.

On motion, it was ordered, that Battle's Lane, or so much
of the same as has been dedicated for street purposes, be ac-
cepted as part of the Street System of the Town of Chapel Hill,
and that a survey of the same be made, giving courses and dis-
tances, and that the same be spread on the minutes of this
meeting.

On motion, it was ordered, that Rosemary Street, from the
Western boundary of the town, East to the angle in said street,
(near Green McDade's lot), be widened to 45 feet, as shown on
the Town-Map. And that the street known as the Merritt Mill
Road, from the point of its intersection with said Rosemary
Street to Franklin Street, also be widened to 45 feet, as
shown on said map of the town. And, that I. W. Pritchard,

W. W. Pickard and S. W. Andrews be appointed a committee to act on behalf of the town and confer with a similar committee of two to act on behalf of the property owners, to assess the damages, if any, which may result from the widening of the said streets.

On motion, it was ordered, that the chairman of the Street-Committee, be instructed to lower the culvert on Rosemary - Street, so as not to interfere with the drainage from the rear of H. H. Patterson' Store-lot.

There being no further business the motion to adjourn prevailed.
