A joint session of the Board of Aldermen and the Board of Graded School Trustees of the Town of Chapel Hill, was held at the Mayor's Office- at 8:30 P.M.

On motion of ~~W. S. Roberson~~ E. A. Abernethy, Mayor-pro-tem, W. S. Roberson- was elected Chairman.

The Chairman appointed C. B. Griffin to act as secretary.

On motion of E. A. Abernethy, N. W. Walker was allowed to vote as proxy for C. H. Herty.

The Chairman stated that the term of office of W. S. Roberson and J. D. Webb expires June 30th- 1913, and that nominations for their successors were in order.

On motion of R. A. Eubanks- W. S. Roberson was elected to succeed himself.

On motion of W. W. Pickard- H. H. Patterson was elected to succeed J. D. Webb.
