SCHEDULE OF LICENSE TAXES FOR THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

1913.

The following schedule of license taxes for the privilege of carrying on the business or doing the act named is hereby established and ordained by the Commissioners of the Town of Chapel Hill for the fiscal year ending April 30th, 1914.

1. Upon each two horse wagon for hire-----	6.00
2. Upon each one horse wagon for hire-----	5.00
3. Upon each buggy for hire -----	5.00
4. Upon each two horse carriage for hire-----	6.00
5. Upon each one horse carriage for hire-----	5.00
6. Upon each vehicle run or operated by a livery stable a tax as specified above, provided that the aggregate tax paid by any livery stable shall not exceed-----	20.00
7. Upon each automobile hauling freight or passengers for hire-----	10.00
8. Upon every dog kept in the town-----	1.00
9. Upon every photographer, whether transient or resident, provided this tax shall not apply to any person except those engaged in photography as their chief or principal business-----	10.00
10. Upon each transient merchant or street pedler	10.00
11. Upon each person, firm or corporation peddling lighting rods, stoves or ranges-----	25.00
12. Upon each skating rink-----	2.00 per month
13. Upon each moving picture or vauderville show	5.00 per wk.
14. Upon each retail seller of killed and dressed meats, except wild game in season-----	10.00
15. Upon each agent for clothing men's furnishings-	10.00
16. Upon each loan office-----	10.00
17. Upon each hotel for transient custom with--	
six rooms or less-----	5.00
fifteen rooms or less-----	7.50
More than fifteen rooms-----	12.50
18. Each hall for theatrical shows-----	10.00
19. Each stage exhibition or slight of hand performance	5.00
20. Upon each person, firm or corporation selling pistols or brass nucks.....	10.00
21. Upon each gypsie or fortune teller-----	10.00
22. Upon each express company-----	10.00
23. Upon each telegraph company-----	10.00
24. Upon each pressing club-----	10.00

Any person, firm or corporation carrying on any of the foregoing businesses or doing any of the foregoing acts in the town of Chapel Hill without first obtaining the license as herein provided shall pay a fine of \$20.00 in addition to the tax.

All ordinances or sections of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Enacted this the 24th day of July, 1913.

Upon Motion of Mr. Hendon, the
 following Ordinance was adopted:

The Board of Aldermen do
 enact, that it shall be unlawful
 any person or persons to allow loose
 papers or litter collect at any
 place within the fire limits
 of the town, or to burn same
 within the fire limits, unless
 the same shall be burned in
 a rubbish burner.

Any person violating this ordi-
 nance shall pay a fine of \$5.00.

The board then adjourned.
