In case their plan of repair should not meet the approval of the St. Com. the St. Com. is authorized to allow the said Highway Commission to do such repairing on any other St. which in their judgment would be wise. Upon Motion the following ordinance was adopted:

Be it ordained that no person shall be allowed to drive any vehicle across any cemetery plot, which has been put in order. And that any one violating this ordinance shall be fined \$100 for each offence.
