

Chapel Hill, N.C.
May 24, 1917.

The Board of Aldermen met at the Mayor's office, at 8 P.M.
Mayor Roberson presiding.

All members of the Board present.
Minutes of last meeting were read
and approved.

On motion of Mr. Word the Finance
Com. was instructed to prepare
an annual budget for the coming year
also prepare a suitable finance book.

On motion of Mr. Roberson an annual
license tax of \$10⁰⁰ was levied on every
automobile run in town for hire
carrying passengers or freight.

On motion of Mr. Word the following
ordinances was adopted:

The Board of Aldermen do enact:
That the Tax Collector is hereby instructed
to make immediate demand for all
past due sewer fees and he is hereby
instructed and ordered to disconnect
all houses from the sewer system if
the owner or tenent of some are more
than three months in arrears in payment
of fees.

On motion of Mr. Hagan it was ordered
that \$700⁰⁰ be paid on sewer note.

On motion of Mr. Word the Mayor and
Treasurer were directed to execute the
following notes: one to the Bank of Chapel
Hill for \$1700⁰⁰ to finish taking up sewer note
one to the Bank of Chapel Hill for \$2500⁰⁰
to take notes it now holds to the
amount of \$2300⁰⁰ and to secure 200⁰⁰ more
for court expenses, and one to the
People's Bank for \$1200⁰⁰ to take up
notes it now holds for total amount.

The Mayor appointed Dr. Wilson, Mr. Hagan
and the Medical Health Officer to consider
extending the dog district and report

At next meeting.

On motion of Mr. Clark the S.T. Com.
was directed to have the elm tree
on Pittsboro St. removed to prevent
the sewer line.

On motion of Dr. Wilson the Board went
into the election of a Chief of Police.
S.T. Long and C.C. Sugg were nominated
but no one was elected.

The Board then adjourned.
