The Board of Aldermen met at the
Mayor's office at 8 P.M.
Mayor Roberson Presiding.
All Members of the Board present
except Mr. Cheek.
On Motion it was ordered that no
poll tax be collected from any one
who is now in the Army or Navy,
and that the same be remitted to
all who have paid for the year 1917.
On Motion it was ordered that the
tax valuation of Patterson Bros'
property be reduced by the same
amount that was taken off by
the County Commissioners on account
of error in listing, and that the
difference be refunded to them.
On Motion of Mr. Word it was ordered
that the office of Night police be
discontinued.
On Motion of Mr. Hogan W.N. Conada
was elected Chief of police and Tax
Collector to take effect June 1.
Upon Motion the following ordinances
were adopted:

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The Town of Chapel Hill;
That no wagon, buggy, or any other obstruction shall be allowed to
remain on that part of Columbia Street West of a line running from
the North-East corner of the scales South to Franklin Street and
South of a line running West from the North-East corner of the scales.
Any one violating the above ordinance shall be fined One Dollar for
each offence.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:
That no person shall allow his dog to run at large in the Town of
Chapel Hill after May 15th, 1918.
Any person violating the above ordinance shall be fined One Dollar
for each offence, or the dog shall be impounded and sold.

The Board then adjourned.
