NOTICE OF ELECTION OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS

Pursuant to the regulations contained in Chapter 56, of the
Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, providing for the ap-
pointment of registrar, judges of elections, registration and the
holding of elections, notice is hereby given of an election to be
held in the Town of Chapel Hill on Tuesday, May 3, 1921, for the
election of a Mayor and a Board of Aldermen consisting of five
members.

The registration books will be kept open for seven days pre-
ceding the day for closing the registration books, to-wit: from
April 15th to April 22nd inclusive, and closed for registration on
the second Saturday before the election.

On the second Saturday before the election, being April 23rd,
the registration books will be kept open at the polling place for
challenges.

J. T. Lloyd has been appointed as Registrar,
and J. T. Portin and George Sparrow
as Judges of Elections.

The Chapel Hill Graded School Building has been designated as
the place for holding the election, and the place where the registra-
tion books will be kept during the registration period, and on the
challenge day and on the election day.
