

that any one violating the above shall be guilty of forcible trespass and shall be prosecuted accordingly.

The finance committee was ordered to make out a schedule for licensing all persons, firms, or corporations doing business in C.H. Mr. Pratt read a list of the things that he desired to see the Board of Aldermen put into effect. It was decided to take up these matters at the next meeting.

The town treasurer was ordered to issue checks to the following persons for the amounts stated for rebate of their taxes listed thru error:

There being no further business the Board adjourned.

June 7, 1921.

The Board of Aldermen met at 7:30 P.M. Mayor Roberson presiding. All members present except Mr. Check. On motion T. F. Hickerson was instructed to complete a traverse map of the town of Chapel Hill; said map to show all property lines as well as the other features of a traverse map; that the map is not to cost over four hundred dollars (\$400.00) and to be completed by September 1st; scale of the map to be 1 inch = 200 feet.

Motion was made and passed that the following ordinance go into effect at once:

Section 1 - That every person, firm or corporation engaged in any trade, business or profession hereinafter mentioned within the limits of the Town of Chapel Hill shall obtain a license therefor as herein provided and such license shall be renewed each year on the first day of June or within thirty days thereafter.

Section 2 - That the following license and privilege taxes are hereby imposed and directed to be collected each year by the town tax collector at the time the license is issued:

Automobiles and other motor driven vehicles... \$1.00

Automobile agencies 10.00

Automobile garages 10.00

Automobile repair shops 10.00

Automobile transfers:

4-passenger car 7.50

7-passenger car 10.00

10-passenger car 15.00

20-passenger car 30.00

Automobile trucks (for public hauling):

1-ton truck 10.00

2-ton truck 20.00

Over 2-ton truck 35.00

Drays for public hauling:

1-horse dray (each) 5.00

2-horse dray (each) 10.00

\$20.00 to cover the tax of

any one doing a general draying

business with horse-drawn vehicles.

Balance of license and privilege tax to be worked out by the Mayor and Mr. Pratt and reported at the next meeting.
