

November 2, 1922

The Board of Aldermen met at 7:30 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

Aldermen present were:- Braune, Cheek, and Durham.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A motion was made and passed allowing Mr. J.E. Temple \$4.50 on his Sanitary Tax for 1920, which sum he paid John McMaster at the time of service.

A motion was made and passed fixing the yearly license tax for Sign Painters at \$5.00.

A motion was made and passed referring to the Manager bill of Elliott-Shoales Co. Of \$40.00 for water used in the construction of the Curb and Gutter, and instructing him to take up with them the faulty construction of the driveways, and to signify the readiness of the Town to pay this bill when these driveways were repaired.

A motion was made and passed instructing the Manager to purchase one "Best Traffic Light" to be placed at the intersection of Franklin and Columbia Streets.

On motion of Alderman Durham, duly seconded by Alderman Braune, the following ordinance was adopted.

WHEREAS, it is found expedient to more adequately protect pedestrian traffic; therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Sect. 1. That there shall be no riding of bicycles on any sidewalks of the town.

Sect. 2. Persons riding bicycles at night must display proper lights.

Sect. 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. Any person violating any section of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be subject to a fine of \$5.00 for each violation.

On motion of Alderman Braune, duly seconded by Alderman Cheek, the ordinance in regard to "Drunkenness and Disorderly Conduct" was amended so as to make the maximum fine \$50.00 for each offense.

A motion was made and passed allowing the members of the Fire Company their Poll Tax for the year 1922.

The Manager was appointed on the committee with Aldermen Braune, Durham, and Odum to confer with the University Officials in regard to asking for an appropriation from the State for the Town.

A motion was made and passed instructing the Manager to pay J.M. Whitaker \$100.00 for work done on the 1922 Tax Books.

On motion the Manager was instructed to have a Street Light placed on the School Walk.

On Motion the Manager was instructed to put in brick gutters along the School Walk from Cameron Ave. to the Athletic Field.

On motion the Manager was instructed to confer with Mr. T.C. Atwood in regard to work to be done by him in restoring the street surface on Raleigh Road.

There being no further business the Board adjourned.
