License and Privilege Taxes

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. To raise revenue for general municipal purposes the license and privilege taxes herein-after enumerated are hereby levied and assessed by the Board of Aldermen and directed to be collected by the Town Tax Collector, upon every person, firm, or corporation engaged in any trade, business, profession or calling mentioned in this ordinance within the limits of the Town of Chapel Hill; and it shall be the duty of every person, firm, or corporation engaging in any such trade, business, profession, or calling within the limits of said town to obtain, on the first day of June, 1923, or within thirty days thereafter a license therefor in the sum herein specified.

Section 2. Any person exercising or carrying on any trade, business, profession or calling for the exercising, carrying on, or doing of which a license tax is required by this ordinance, without first taking out the license required by this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not exceeding Fifty Dollars for each offense, and for each day this section is violated such person, clerk

or agent shall be guilty of a separate offense.

Section 3. All licenses issued under this ordinance on and after the first day of June, 1923, shall be for not less than the current fiscal year unless otherwise provided in the section fixing the tax; PROVIDED, that after six months of the fiscal year shall have expired, the tax shall be one-half the amount charged for the year.

Section 4. The adoption of this schedule of privilege and license taxes shall not abridge the right of the Board of Aldermen to change, alter, increase or decrease any of the taxes herein levied at any time; and when any increase is made the license shall be revoked unless such increase be paid within thirty days.

Section 5. Any license issued under this ordinance shall be subject to revocation by the Board of Aldermen, or by the granting official, without refund of any part of the tax paid, PROVIDED, in the judgment of the Board, or granting official, the business license does by reason of its nature manner or place in which it is conducted, constitute a nuisance or is a menace to good order or to public health or morals. The Board of Aldermen met at 5 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

Aldermen present were Messers. R.P.Andrews, G.M. Braune and J.M.Cheek.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman G.M.Braune the following appointments were made:

Asst. Chief Fire Department J.W.Huskee

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek the following resolution was duly passed:

Section 1. That section 14 of the License and Privilege Tax Schedule be amended as follows:

Milk Dealers - Dairies and Deliverers of Milk in Town:

Dairies less than 5 cows -----\$1.00 per cow
Dairies 5 to 20 Cows -----\$10.00 per year
Dairies over 20 cows 50¢ additional for each cow.

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman G.M.Braune the following ordinance was duly passed:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That Section 6 of the Automobile Regulations be suspended.

Section 2. That all automobiles in the business district shall be parked parallel to the curb and within 18 inches of the curb.

Section 3. That automobiles shall not be parked more than one deep.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in effect from Saturday, June 9 to and including Wednesday June 13th.

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman G.M.Braune Section 6 of the Automobile Regulations was amended as follows:

Be IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 6. In the business district all automobiles

shall be parked on the right at an angle of 45 degrees with the curb and against the curb.

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek the Sanitary Ordinances were amended so as to require the use of paper drinking cups at all soda fountains. (This revives Section 22 of the Sanitary Ordinances.)

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek the following resolution was duly passed:

Section 1. That the Budget of the Town of Chapel Hill for the year 1923-24 as submitted by the Manager be approved and placed on file in his office.

Section 2. That notice be given of a public hearing to be held in the Mayor's Office on Monday, June 18th at 5 P.M. before the final adoption of said budget.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 6:30 P.M.

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill met at 9 A.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield the following ordinance was passed:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That the Emergency Automobile Regulation be repealed.

Section 2. That Section 6 of the Automobile Regulations be amended to read as follows:

All automobiles in the business district shall be parked on the right at an angle of 45 degrees with the curb and against the curb. Automobiles shall be considered as parked when left by the drivers.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 10 A.M.
